AN ORDINANCE

CALLING AN ELECTION ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF

 ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 1,850,000

 OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 1,600,000 PARKS AND
 RECREATION IMPROVEMENT AND EXTENSION BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF
 THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 190,000 WITTE MUSEUM ADDITIONS AND IMPROVE-
 MENT BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF
 \$ 240,000 BRANCH PUBLIC LIBRARY BONDS; ON THE
 PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$ 268,000 FIRE STATION BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS:

1. That an election be held in the said City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 29th day of November, 1955, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted to the resident, qualified electors of the City of San Antonio, Texas, who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$ 3,952,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of building, grading, paving, curbing, and improving the streets of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$ 2,250,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of improving and extending the Sanitary Sewer System of said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of

\$ 2,750,000 maturing serially in such install-
ments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being
not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a
rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable
property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest
and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the
purpose of constructing and improving storm sewers, and the storm
drainage appurtenances and accessories thereto of said City as
authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas,
and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas
be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of
\$ 1,900,000 maturing serially in such install-
ments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity
being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest
at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all
taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual
interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity
for the purpose of acquiring rights of way and improving and
extending facilities and runways at the San Antonio International
Airport owned by said City as authorized by the Constitution and
laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 5

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas,
be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of
\$ 1,850,000 maturing serially in such install-
ments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity
being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest
at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all
taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual
interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity,
for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new
Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the
Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of
the City of San Antonio.

PROPOSITION NO. 6

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas,
be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of
\$ 268,000 maturing serially in such install-
ments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity
being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest
at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all
taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual
interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity
for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping fire
stations within said City as authorized by the Constitution and
laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 7

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas,
be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of
\$ 1,600,000 maturing serially in such install-

ments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of acquiring property for and extending, improving, and constructing Parks and Recreational facilities in said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 8

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$ 240,000, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of constructing Branch Public Libraries and the purchase of sites incidental thereto in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 9

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$ 190,000, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of improving and extending ~~the building adjacent to~~ the Witte Museum, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

2. That voting machines shall be employed at the election herein ordered in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Article 7.14, and voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes in the office of the City Clerk, which absentee balloting shall be conducted in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject, and said election shall be held at the polling places in the regularly prescribed voting precincts of the City of San Antonio, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 P.M. Central Standard Time. Such voting precincts, and polling places, being as follows:

3. That said election shall be held in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1, Title 22 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended, including the provisions of Article 704, as amended by Chapter 382, passed at the first called session of the 44th Legislature, and the City Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas, and only legally qualified electors who own taxable property in the City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be qualified to vote.

4. The ballots for said election shall ^{have} written or printed thereon the following:

5. A copy of this Ordinance, signed by the Mayor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk shall serve as proper notice of said election. Notice shall be given in accordance with Article 704, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, of 1925, as amended. The Mayor is authorized and directed to have a copy of said notice posted at the City Hall in said City and at each of the voting places in said City, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date fixed for holding said election. He shall also cause said notice to be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in the Commercial Recorder, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date set for said election. Except as otherwise provided in said Article 704, as amended, the manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws governing general elections.

6. Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, that requires this ordinance to become effective at once,
