

A RESOLUTION

74-18-22

OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, APPROVING THE CREATION OF A SISTER CITY AFFILIATION BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE CITY OF GUADALAJARA, JALISCO, MEXICO, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO TAKE THE NECESSARY STEPS TO EFFECTUATE THE AFFILIATION PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, "the People to People Program" was inaugurated by the President of the United States in 1956 to establish greater friendship and understanding between the peoples of the United States and other nations through Sister City Affiliation, a medium of direct, personal contact, and

WHEREAS, Guadalajara is the Capital of the State of Jalisco and one of the most dynamic and progressive cities in Mexico, and

WHEREAS, San Antonio and Guadalajara have always enjoyed a friendly relationship which has been manifest in many areas recently such as participation of the State of Jalisco in the Mexican Trade Fair held in San Antonio and goodwill visits by official San Antonio delegations to Guadalajara's Friendship Week Festival, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Guadalajara Municipal Government and the City Council of the City of San Antonio to further enhance the mutual friendship which exists by the designation of San Antonio and Guadalajara as Sister Cities; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The formation of a Sister City Affiliation between the City of San Antonio and the City of Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico, is hereby approved.


SECTION 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to act as the official representative of the City of San Antonio to carry out the intent of this Resolution.
