

AN ORDINANCE 44628

CALLING AN ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF ADOPTION OF THE STATE LAW APPLICABLE TO POLICEMEN WHICH ESTABLISHES COLLECTIVE BARGAINING WHEN A MAJORITY OF THE AFFECTED EMPLOYEES FAVOR REPRESENTATION BY AN EMPLOYEES' ASSOCIATION AND WHICH PRESERVES THE PROHIBITION OF STRIKES AND LOCKOUTS AND PROVIDES PENALTIES THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, a petition by City of San Antonio Policemen was filed with the City Clerk on November 7, 1974, requesting that the aforementioned question be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors, and

WHEREAS, Section 5(b) of the Fire and Police Employee Relations Act (Art. 5154 C-1, H. B. 185, 63rd Texas Legislature) provides for an election on the aforementioned question upon filing of the required petition, and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has determined that said petition was signed by a sufficient number of qualified voters who voted in the last general election and so certified to the Council on November 21, 1974; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. An election shall be held in the City of San Antonio on Tuesday, the 17th day of December, 1974, at which election the following question initiated by petition shall be submitted to the qualified electors residing in the City of San Antonio:

FOR or AGAINST the following:

Adoption of the state law applicable to policemen which establishes collective bargaining when a majority of the affected employees favor representation by an employees' association and which preserves the prohibition of strikes and lockouts and provides penalties therefor.

SECTION 2. Voting machines shall be employed in said election in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code and they shall be used for the casting of absentee ballots in the Office of the City Clerk.

SECTION 3. Said election shall be held in the City of San Antonio between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A. M. and 7:00 o'clock P. M.

SECTION 4. All qualified electors residing in the City of San Antonio shall be able to vote in said election.


CERTIFICATE
