

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, SEPTEMBER 8TH, 1915,
AT FOUR O'CLOCK, P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert Kearny and Steves.

Minutes of the previous meeting were ordered approved.

MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS.

The petition of W.S. Conness, regarding sidewalk on Diaz Street, was read and referred to the sidewalk Inspector.

The petition of T.T. Jackson, for building permit, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Fire & Police, Steves.

The petition of R.P. Green, for refund of unexpired part of license, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Taxation, Garland.

The petition of Chas. P. Smith & Sons, for reduction of paving assessment on Main Avenue, between E. Quincy & Elmira Street, was read and referred to the streets and bridges Commissioner.

The petition of the League of Texas Municipalities, urging City of San Antonio to maintain membership, was read and ordered filed. Adopted.

The petition of E.J. A Itgelt, relating to the width of North Flores Street, was read and ordered filed. Adopted.

The petition of property owners on Bowie Street, asking payment for land taken to straighten said street, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

The petition of citizens for paving Craig Place, from Belknap Place to McCullough Avenue, was read and ordered filed. Adopted.

The petition of citizens for the paving of Peach Street, from Goliad Street to Victoria Street, was read and ordered filed. Adopted.

Accepting proposal of Southern Structural Steel Company for furnishing and erecting steel plate door in jail, and authorizing contract and appropriating money therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section One. (ACCEPTANCE) That the City does hereby accept the attached written proposal of said party named in the caption hereof, dated August 31st, 1915, and offering to furnish deliver and erect steel door entering jail building, and two steel partitions walls therein, in and for said City in accordance with the written specifications and description and drawings prepared and submitted by said Southern Structural Steel Company with said proposal, provided said party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made by or under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

Section Two. (CONTRACT, ETC.) That the Mayor is hereby authorized to cause and require the execution and delivery of a written contract to be drawn in accordance with said proposal, and the terms and conditions understood and required as applicable to said matter.

Section Three. (APPROPRIATION) That to defray the cost and expenses to be paid by the City by reason of the premises, the sum of One Hundred and Sixty Five (\$165.75) Dollars and Seventy-Five cents, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund for that purpose.

Section One. (ACCEPTANCE) That the City does hereby accept the attached written proposal of said party named in the caption hereof, dated August 31st, 1915, and offering to construct iron stairways at New Police & Fire Station, in and for said City in accordance with the written specifications and description and drawings prepared and submitted by Emmet T. Jackson, City Building Inspector, provided said party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made by or under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

Section Two. (CONTRACT, ETC. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to cause and require the execution and delivery of a written contract to be drawn in accordance with said proposal, and the terms and conditions understood and required as applicable to said matter.

Section Three. (APPROPRIATION) That to defray the costs and expenses to be paid by the City by reason of the premises, the sum of Seven Hundred and Forty Two (\$742.75) Dollars and Seventy-Five cents, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund for that purpose.

(ACCEPTANCE) That the City does hereby accept the attached written proposal of said party named in the caption hereof, dated September 1st, 1915, and offering to furnish all materials, tools, and labor and erect a twin 6' 3" by 9' reinforced concrete box culvert on South Presa Street, at School Street, in and for said City in accordance with the written specifications and description and drawings prepared and submitted by the City Engineers Department, provided said party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made by or under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

Section Two. (BONDS) That the Mayor is hereby authorized to require and approve on behalf of the City proper bond or bonds for the performance and completion of said undertakings. (CONTRACT, ETC.) That the Mayor is hereby authorized to cause and require the execution and delivery of a written contract to be drawn in accordance with said proposal, and the terms and conditions understood and required as applicable to said matter.

Section Three. (APPROPRIATION) That to defray the costs and expenses to be paid by the City by reason of the premises, the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred (\$3,600.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Street Paving Fund.
