

AN ORDINANCE

CALLING AN ELECTION ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE
ISSUANCE OF \$2,150,000.00 NEW POLICE HEADQUARTERS
BUILDING BONDS. 3

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That an election be held in the said City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 10th day of June, 1958, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the resident, qualified electors of the City of San Antonio, Texas, who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation:

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,150,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

2. That voting machines shall be employed at the election herein ordered in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Article 7.14, and voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes in the office of the City Clerk, which absentee balloting shall be conducted in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject, and said election shall be held at the polling places in the regularly prescribed voting precincts of the City of San Antonio, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 P.M. 


5. A copy of this Ordinance, signed by the Mayor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk shall serve as proper notice of said election. Notice shall be given in accordance with Article 704, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, of 1925, as amended. The mayor is authorized and directed to have a copy of said notice posted at the City Hall in said City and at each of the voting places in said City, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date fixed for holding said election. He shall also cause said notice to be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in the Commercial Recorder, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date set for said election. Except as otherwise provided in said Article 704, as amended, the manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws governing general elections.

6. An emergency exists for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, requiring that this ordinance become effective immediately, therefore, upon passage, this ordinance by an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the City Council, shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

A G R E E M E N T

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas, on the 17th day of June, 1940, entered an Order under the provisions of Article 2997-a, Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, as amended, directing that voting machines be the medium of voting in all elections to be held in said County aforesaid after August 15, 1940, except absentee voting; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of San Antonio, by Ordinance duly passed and approved on the 19th day of May, 1958, authorized and called an election to be held in the City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 10th day of June, 1958, for the purpose of issuing bonds in the sum of TWO MILLION ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND (\$2,150,000.00) DOLLARS, to be used for the erection of a Police Building; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas, by Order duly passed and approved on the 19th day of May, 1958, authorized and called an election to be held in Bexar County, Texas, on the 10th day of June, 1958, for the purpose of issuing bonds in the sum of THREE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND (\$2,850,000.00) DOLLARS, to be used for the erection of a County Jail; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by said City Council and said Commissioners Court that it is feasible and economical to hold both said elections at the same time, at the same polling places inside the City of San Antonio and upon the same voting machines to be placed at said voting places, for the convenience of the electors of said City and County by affording them an opportunity to vote upon both of said bond issues at the same time; and

WHEREAS, the said Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas, on the 6th day of June, 1958, passed an Order authorizing and empowering the County Judge of Bexar County, Texas, to enter into a Contract and Agreement with the City of San Antonio to lease or rent to said City approximately one hundred and sixty two (162) voting machines which said voting machines are now in the custody of Bexar County, Texas, for use of said City in the holding of its bond election on the 10th day of June, 1958; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Commissioners Court of Bexar County and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to hold said elections on the 10th day of June, 1958, jointly with each other, the respective parties to pay an equitable proportion of the election expenses caused thereby; and

WHEREAS, the Order also authorizing leasing the several voting machines to the City of San Antonio for the purpose of holding its election on said June 10, 1958, was upon the basis of TEN (\$10.00) DOLLARS for each machine furnished by the County of Bexar, being one-half (1/2) of the amount regularly fixed by the Commissioners Court of Bexar County for the rental of voting machines, because of the joint use thereof by said County and City, and it further appearing that it would be equitable that drayage charges to and from the polling places within the City of San Antonio should be borne equally by the City and County, as well as all incidental expenses of preparation and servicing; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the parties to this said AGREEMENT that the cost of the election officials presiding over the election precincts within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio should be jointly paid by the County of Bexar and the City of San Antonio, and it appearing that the County of Bexar can only participate in the payment of such officials to the extent that they are permitted to name personnel according

to the number of voting machines in an election precinct, the cost of the election officials to be borne by the County of Bexar shall not exceed one-half (1/2) of the pay that would be due to the number of election officials which they are authorized by law to appoint, the said City of San Antonio to bear not less than one-half (1/2) of the pay of such election officials, and it appearing that it would be proper for the City of San Antonio to bear the entire expense of any additional election officials which may be deemed necessary by said City of San Antonio, they shall be employed at the sole expense of the said City of San Antonio. It is further provided that the cost of preparation and servicing the voting machines to be used within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio shall be borne equally by Bexar County and the City of San Antonio.

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That this AGREEMENT entered into by and between the County of Bexar acting by and through its duly authorized, elected, qualified and acting Judge, Charles W. Anderson, hereinafter called "the County" and the City of San Antonio, a duly incorporated city of Texas, acting by and through its duly authorized City Manager, Lynn Andrews, hereinafter called "the City".

W I T N E S S E T H:

That said County thus agrees to rent to said City one hundred sixty two (162) voting machines, which voting machines are now in the custody of said County, for use jointly by the City and said County in the bond election to be held on the 10th day of June, 1958, at the rate of TEN (\$10.00) DOLLARS per machine.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the County and the City are to share equally the cost of preparation of said machines for said election on the 10th day of June, 1958, and the cost of servicing

said machines prior to and on the date of said election, the City and County each to pay one-half (1/2) of the drayage to and from the polling places within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, said drayage to be paid from the present place of storage of the various voting machines to each of the several election places within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, and the drayage necessary for the return of said voting machines from said voting places to the present place of storage or to such place within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio as may be designated by the Commissioners Court of Bexar County, Texas.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that the said City and County are to share equally the pay of all common and jointly appointed election officials. In this connection, however, it is understood that the County can only employ election officials in accordance with the voting machine law which allows for certain numbers of officials depending upon the number of voting machines used at the designated polling places.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that said County will furnish all ballot forms on the face of the machine for the official ballot for the bond election, together with separate poll list forms and return forms for polling places and all necessary supplies for holding of its portion of said election and, likewise, said City shall furnish the ballot forms for its official ballot for said bond election, separate poll lists and return forms, for the holding of its portion of said election.


IT IS FURTHER AGREED that said City will pay for such machines as are necessary for use in absentee voting at the rate of TEN (\$10.00) DOLLARS per machine as above provided, and will pay one-half (1/2) of all necessary expenses of preparation, drayage to and from the storage place of such machines, as well as all other necessary expense for absentee voting in the said bond election.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that said City and County shall be jointly and equally liable for all damages to or destruction of any voting machine which shall occur from any cause whatsoever in any polling place within said City of San Antonio, PROVIDED FURTHER, that said City and County shall be jointly and equally liable for damages to or destruction of any voting machines to be used by said County and City for absentee voting while in the polling places provided by said City.

IT IS HEREBY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that for the purposes of enforcing this provision, the machines shall be inspected jointly by an agent of said City and by an agent of said County at the time said machines are removed from storage for use in the bond election on June 10, 1958, and that any damage or defects then existing to any of said machines shall be recorded. Upon the return of the said machines after their use in the bond election of June 10, 1958, immediately after they are unloaded and before they are placed in storage, said machines shall be again inspected by an agent of the City and by an agent of the County for the purpose of determining what damages, if any, have occurred during the period of custody of said City. The damages so determined by the agents of the County and the City, if any, shall be the basis of the joint liability of the City and County under this provision of the contract.






