COMMENDING THE SOUTH TEXAS MEDICAL SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE ON ITS SPLENDID EFFORTS TOWARD ESTABLISHING A MEDICAL BRANCH OF THE UNIVERSITY IN SAN ANTONIO.

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WHEREAS the San Antonio Medical Foundation in December 1959 organized a committee of one hundred leading San Antonio business and professional people to be known as the South Texas Medical School Development Committee, and

WHEREAS this committee was charged with making an intensive effort to unify the plans for a medical school with supporting teaching-hospital facilities, and

WHEREAS this school development committee has recommended the construction of a teaching hospital on the Oak Hills site heretofore offered for that purpose and has further recommended that provisions be made for the rehabilitation of the Robert B. Green Memorial Hospital to be coordinated into the total plan of the Board of Regents of the University of Texas.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO that the San Antonio Medical Foundation and the South Texas Medical School Development Committee be commended for their positive actions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council joins in the sustained efforts to locate a modern teaching facility here which will benefit the vast area of which San Antonio is the center.

FURTHERMORE this Council pledges to the Board of Regents of the University of Texas and the San Antonio Medical Foundation all possible support to make this hospital plan become a reality.

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Dr. Johnson moved adoption of the resolution, seconded by Mr. Dietert, it was passed and approved by the following vote; AYES: Kuykendall, Dietert, McMahon, Johnson, Simpson, Olivares, Pinson and San Martin; NAYS: None; ABSENT: Passur.

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Dr. Johnson made a motion that when the Council accepts the resignation of Dr. San Martin the Council will appoint Mr. George de la Garza to the City Council. The motion was approved by the following vote: AYES: Kuykendall, Dietert, McMahon, Simpson, Olivares, Pinson; ASTAINED: San Martin; NAYS: None; ABSENT: Passur.

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Dr. San Martin stated that inasmuch as public ownership of the San Antonio Transit System has completed one year of operation he would make a motion to commend the Board for its work in making improvements and in keeping the rates low. Seconded by Dr. Johnson the motion carried by the following vote: AYES: Kuykendall, Dietert, McMahon, Johnson, Simpson, Olivares, Pinson and San Martin; NAYS: None; ABSENT: Passur.

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The Mayor instructed the City Clerk to write a letter to the transit board informing it of this action.

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The City Manager stated as a matter of information that it was pointed out several months ago that the City would run into trouble and problems regarding the sewer service charge. He asked if the Council would be in general agreement to advise the people to pay their bills and any correction made later by the Council will be rebated or refunded to the first billing of the sewer service charge. Mr. Pinson said he thought that was implied in Council's original policy.

Mr. David Halpenny, 345 North Drive, inquired if anything had been done about obtaining an itemized audit of the City Public Service Board. Mayor Kuykendall stated that the Council has the request but that nothing had been done yet. He felt that until such time as present negotiations are finished the Council should not go into it, and will give his request more consideration.

Police Chief George Bichsel made the following report:

TO: Mr. Lynn Andrews, City Manager

 SUBJECT: Off-Duty Police Employment
 DATE: May 11, 1960

Police officers are permitted to work for other employers subject to applicable Personnel Rules and Police Department Rules and Regulations:

Personnel Rules

Police Department Rules and Regulations No. 56. "Police officers shall always be considered available for duty while within the City limits of San Antonio and shall carry their badge and an approved pistol or revolver."

Police Department Rules and Regulations No. 89. "No police officer shall engage in any outside business or employment without the written permission of the Chief of Police. Permission granted to work a gainful occupation or employment during off-duty hours will continue in effect unless it is for work in a place where beer or intoxicating liquor is sold or served. Employment in the latter classification terminates at the end of each two months' period coincident with the rotation of shifts and must be renewed if such employment is to continue. Officers working special jobs and performing police duties, whether in uniform or civilian clothes, must enforce all laws as though on actual duty for the Police Department of the City of San Antonio. No Police officer shall own, operate or have any financial interest in any business of any kind without written permission from the Chief of Police."

Special Order No. 18 (Amending Rule #89). "Effective March 15, 1956, approval of "off Duty Employment" in establishments permitting the consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises will be discontinued. This will not apply to the Auditorium, the Coliseum, Mission Stadium or the Wrestlethon, where the primary purpose of the officer is "Crowd Control".

Application for off-duty employment is made on a special form (sample attached) in two copies. After approval the original is filed in the Chief's office. The officer retains the duplicate to verify permission when checked. Should the Chief of Police deem any work request to be conflicting with the best interests of the department, the application is rejected. Officers are limited to twenty (20) hours per week off-duty employment.

In essence the employment of off-duty police by private enterprise, public schools, civic organizations, etc., actually supplements the effectiveness of the Police Department to some extent. Traffic control for weddings, funerals, banks, and the like, benefits the employer primarily, but also benefits the general driving and walking public. Crowd control and maintenance of order in Mission Stadium, Alamo Stadium, the Municipal Auditorium, La Villita, the Wrestlethon, etc., would frequently require on-duty police, if off-duty police were not employed. Stores like Joske's, Handy-Andy, H.E.B., etc., actually relieve the Police Department of some responsibility and conserve our manpower for other duties, by employing off-duty police to protect their stores against armed

robbery, shop-lifting, hot checks, etc. Officers employed to maintain order in cafes, hotels, etc., save many requests for police service.

Chief Bichsel then stated that he discussed the matter with several men employed in off-duty capacity at Joske's and other stores for which Texas Industrial Surveys is the contractor. In all cases, the officer will merely continue to act as a police officer but remain on the premises of the employer who is paying for the service. The instructions to them are to roam the store at will and look for shop lifters and if any violation is detected to take the same action as if on duty. There is no restraint on them and it is not necessary to get clearance before action is taken. These men are regular detectives, and have access to files and photographs. They go through the store and alert clerks and leave mug shots with them so they might recognize known hot check artists. In a way it is a service to the store but also a service to the community.

After discussion of the matter, Dr. Johnson requested that this report and pertinent facts be sent to the persons who appeared on the matter last week.

- 5 -9-60 Petition of Mr. W. Pat Camp, asking for the closing and abandonment of an alley and dead end streets in NCB 7154, was referred to the Land Division of the Finance Department.
