

MAY 25, 1944

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO,
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS,
AT 10:00 O'CLOCK, A.M., ON THURSDAY, MAY 25th, 1944.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein and Anderson. ABSENT: Steffler. Mayor Mauermann
presiding.

Commissioner Anderson requested that the reading of the Minutes be delayed to allow him to introduce, for first reading, an ordinance granting a franchise to the San Antonio Transit Company. He explained that it was necessary to thus suspend the regular order of business in order to permit one or two interested gentlemen to leave, as soon as possible, for another city where they were to attend exercises at which their daughters were being graduated. By agreement of the Council, Commissioner Anderson then introduced and the City Clerk read, in full, on first reading, an Ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE

GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO THE SAN ANTONIO TRANSIT COMPANY TO OPERATE MOTOR BUSES IN LOCAL STREET TRANSPORTATION.

The City Clerk read the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of May 18th, 1944, and of the Special Meeting of May 19th, 1944, which Minutes were each approved, as read, on motion of Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan, and carried by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein and Anderson; Nay, Steffler (Absent).

The Clerk read the following letter:

"TO THE HONORABLE GUS B. MAUERMANN, MAYOR, AND THE
CITY COMMISSIONERS, OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS

"San Antonio Transit Company hereby makes application for a franchise to operate motor buses over the streets of San Antonio, on terms that shall be mutually acceptable to the City of San Antonio and the Company.
