

JULY 8, 1943

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD AT 10:00 O'CLOCK, A.M., THURSDAY, JULY 8, 1943, IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER AT THE CITY HALL, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.

PRESENT:- Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Mayor Mauermann presiding.

The Minutes of the meetings held on June 24th, 1943 and July 1, 1943, were read by the City Clerk and on motions duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Minutes of both meetings were approved as read.

A petition was presented by Mr. R. W. Helms as spokesman for certain residents of Harlandale asking for annexation to the City of San Antonio.

A petition was then presented by Mr. E. C. N. Schuette as spokesman for certain other residents of Harlandale, protesting the proposed annexation. Both petitions were referred to the City Attorney for his recommendation.

A petition of Mr. Charles Fritz for permission to keep two horses at 422 Sandmeyer Street was re-read by the Clerk and referred to Commissioner Hein for action.

Two petitions were presented for refund of taxes which had been paid twice, one from the Guaranty Abstract & Title Company on the South 69.8 feet of Lot 14, Block 1, N.C.B. 2463, for 1936 and on Lot 4, Block 2, N.C.B. 2464 in the sum of \$7.85; the other from Alamo Abstract & Title Guaranty Company in the amount of \$8.62. Both were referred to Commissioner Callaghan.

A petition of A. P. Haynes for permission to vacate subdivision known as Mary Claude Place Number 1 was read and referred to the City Engineer for his recommendation.
