

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, JUNE 9TH, A. D. 1921, 4 P. M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden and Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS

Petition of Citizens requesting that N. Smith Street, from Leal to Morales Streets be kept open, was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

Petition of Citizens on E. Craig Place complaining of certain traffic, and requesting that street be sprinkled, was read and referred to Commissioner of Sanitation, etc.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police;

Zay Smith, for permit to operate musical instrument on River Avenue, F. H. Yeagley, for permit to construct shingle roof.

Commissioner Lambert introduced the following ordinances, which were read and laid over for further consideration;

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating money to defray the expense of engineering services and expert advice on Romana Street Cut Off, also the proposed bridge in Brackenridge Park.

Also,

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating money to pay Metcalf and Eddy, consulting engineers, design of Romana Street Cut Off and additional copies of reports of Flood prevention

The matter of granting a permit for the use of San Pedro Springs Park by the Colored Citizens for emancipation celebration was taken up. Commissioner Pfeiffer, acting on behalf of himself and Commissioner Lambert, submitted the following recommendation, which was adopted by the Commissioners:

"We your committee recommend that the Colored organizations, comprising the Y.W.C.A., Orphans Home, Library Board, Mothers Club and Rescue Home be given the use of San Pedro Park for June 19th celebration, and that the first three shall have charge of the stand privileges, and that the latter two organizations shall have charge of the dance hall (Pavillion) privileges, provided all shall be entitled to an equitable distribution of the profits of such privileges, and all such privileges shall be for the use of said charitable organizations.

On motion of Commissioner Pfeiffer, duly seconded and carried, this recommendation of the Committee was to be considered in lieu of any previous action taken by the Commissioners in the matter.

No. 6 AN ORDINANCE MD-1700 Appropriating funds to pay certain notes of the City of San Antonio.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

1st. There is hereby appropriated out of the 1920 General Fund, to pay notes No's 3, 5, 9, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21, 23, 25 & 27 of the City of San Antonio held by the Alamo National Bank, San Antonio, Texas, the sum of \$775,000.00 Interest on same 27,778.43

2nd. There is hereby appropriated out of the 1920 General Fund, to pay notes No's 4, 6, 10, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 22, 24, 26 & 28, of the City of San Antonio, held by the State National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, the sum of 775,000.00 Interest on same 27,778.43 \$1,605,556.86

No. 7. AN ORDINANCE -1401

Appropriating \$2650.00 to pay special weekly pay roll.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the following sums be and the same are hereby appropriated out of the hereinafter named funds to pay special weekly pay roll for week ending June 4, 1921. to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE. *-1403*

Appropriating \$169.90 to pay A. E. Rheiner account work of setting back Graves Bldg. S. Alamo Street.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that the sum of \$169.90 be and is, hereby appropriated out of the Street Opening and Widening Fund of 1919, to pay A. E. Rheiner for force account work in setting back Graves Bldg., S. Alamo Street, as per estimate of City Engineer on file in office of City Auditor.

AN ORDINANCE. *-1404*

Appropriating \$60.00 to purchase stamps for City Collector's office.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is, hereby appropriated out of the 1920 General Fund to pay the U. S. Postoffice for postage stamps for use of the City Collector's office.

An Ordinance Accepting bid of the Bevan Hill Wood & Coal Yard to supply Coal for the various City Departments, was read once and layed over for further consideration.

Bids for installing lighting fixtures in Milam Park were received from Schroeder Electric Co. Travis Electric Co. Phillippe & Crowther and Wright Bros., were opened and referred to City Purchasing Agent.

A Bid for galvanized corrugated Culverts was received from Wilson Tank & Culvert Co. and was opened and referred to the City Purchasing Agent.

On motion, duly seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.
