RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Honorable State Highway Commission of Texas has seen fit to change the route of Official Highway No. 3 so as not now to touch the communities of Kirby, Converse, Randolph Field, Schertz, Cibollo, Marion and MacQueeney, respectively, and have designated the highway touching these communities as Old Highway No. 3; and,

WHEREAS, many citizens and merchants of the City of San Antonio engage in business with the merchants situated and residing in the above named communities; and,

WHEREAS, the merchants of the City of San Antonio will be caused great expenses, inconvenience and valuable time if their travel is restricted to the new highway No. 3 in visiting and transacting business with the above named communities; and,

WHEREAS, it is found that many citizens of San Antonio will be benefitted if the Honorable State Highway Commission will in the future maintain Oil Highway No. 3 as one of the official highways of Texas; NOW, THEREFORE:-

BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the City Council of the City of San Antonio upon behalf of the citizens and merchants of the City of San Antonio respectfully request the Honorable State Highway Commission of Texas to include and continue to recognize Old Highway No. 3 as one of the official highways of the State of Texas, and to keep the same in such state of repair as is consistent with safe travel.
