Mayor McAllister presented Mr. Jose de la Cruz with a Citation on behalf of the Council and the Citizens of San Antonio, expressing thanks and appreciation for his outstanding act of citizenship in assisting Detective Investigator Medellin in subduing two men whom he was attempting to arrest.

Mayor McAllister read the following letter:

ATTENTION: Honorable Walter W. McAllister  
Mayor of San Antonio

Gentlemen:

We wish to advise the City Council of the City of San Antonio that, on February 5, 1963, the Board of Directors passed Resolution No. R-264 which in part stated:

"2. That the Manager of the San Antonio River Authority, Victor H. Braunig, be authorized and he is hereby directed to enter into negotiations with the General Manager of the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority to determine if the Managers of the two River Authorities can agree on a plan for the diversion of water from the watershed of the Guadalupe and Blanco Rivers to the watershed of the San Antonio River for domestic and municipal uses principally in but not limited to Bexar County, Texas, said plan to be subject to the approval of the respective Boards of Directors."

We are likewise advising the Texas Water Commission and the Board of Directors of the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority of our action.

Our Manager will attempt to obtain a tentative agreement for the delivery of the maximum amount of water available out of the watershed of the Guadalupe and Blanco Rivers to Bexar County under the most economical plan for such maximum amount of water.

If a tentative plan can be agreed upon we will then present it to the City Water Board and the City Council for their consideration.

In connection with the above letter, the Mayor made the following statement:

After several lengthy meetings with the Chairman of the River Authority; other representatives of the Board and their engineer, Mr. Sasse; and upon receipt of a written statement from the River Authority as to their intentions and objectives, I wish to make the following statement:

1. There is a complete meeting of minds that the objective of all is to secure an adequate water supply for the City of San Antonio at the best price possible.
2. City Water Board as the agent of the City Council is responsible for supplying water to metropolitan San Antonio and it has worked long and hard to get an adequate amount of additional cheap water.
3. San Antonio River Authority has a plan of procedure to obtain water which though it is more costly, will receive full and careful consideration if it is offered to

the City of San Antonio.

4. Both City Water Board and San Antonio River Authority have statutory authority to obtain water.

5. The City has no objection to the River Authority's negotiating with any other river authority in an effort to obtain the best answer to our problem. We sincerely hope that the San Antonio River Authority, through its engineer, Mr. Braunig, can secure an acceptable proposal. Should such a proposal be submitted, it will be studied by the Water Board, and a report and recommendation made to the Council.

6. The Council of the City of San Antonio is the final authority who must determine what is the best deal for the citizens of San Antonio.

7. As no proposal has been made, hence, cannot be studied to determine its desirability, any conclusions expressed by anyone under these circumstances is political in nature, or at best, wishful thinking.

8. All parties should continue to cooperate and proceed carefully and without haste in finding a solution to the problem.

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On motion of Mr. Bremer, seconded by Mr. Kaufman, the Mayor's statement was adopted as statement of policy of the Council. The motion carried by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, de la Garza, Kaufman, Gunstream, Gatti, Padilla, Parker and Bremer; NAYS: None, ABSENT: Rohlf's.

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Mr. Lamar Philips, representing the Alamo Motor Club, stated that the Board of Directors of the Club had passed a resolution requesting the Council to pass an ordinance to control wrecker-drivers, and outlined eight points of an ordinance which they suggested be considered for passage by the Council, and which had previously been submitted to the City Attorney for study. The request was taken under advisement.

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Mr. Harry Burns, local President of the N. A. A. C. P., asked the Council to pass an ordinance which would forbid discrimination in certain public places such as motels, hotels and restaurants or theatres, because of race, color or religion, and making violations a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not exceeding \$200.00, the ordinance being similar to the one passed by the City of El Paso in June 1962.

Speaking in favor of such an ordinance were: Father Sherrill Smith, Assistant Pastor, Saint Joseph Catholic Church, representing the Catholic Interracial Council; Rev. C. W. Black, Pastor, Mount Zion Baptist Church, and President of the Baptist Ministers Association; Mr. Jim Taylor; Reverend J. C. Bailey, Pastor, Saint John's Baptist Church; Reverend C. C. Brown, Pastor, Tried Stone Baptist Church; and also speaking was Mr. Joe A. Guerra, Jr., Secretary of the Mexican Chamber of Commerce.

Mayor McAllister stated that the Council had considered the previous request submitted by Mr. Burns, and it was the Council's opinion that an ordinance of that kind would be improper, but perhaps opinions have changed. He said the matter would be referred to the Legal Department for study and if the City Attorney felt that the ordinance was not unconstitutional, the Council would give it further consideration.
