REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO,
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS
AT 10:00 O'CLOCK, A. M. ON THURSDAY, MAY 4TH, 1944.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein and Anderson. ABSENT: Steffler. Mayor Mauermann presiding.

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City Attorney Cobbs explained that the last two Ordinances were passed in order to move the tract deeded to Myers Spalti Manufacturing Company over about twelve feet, deeding them the same amount of land, in order to allow the M. K. & T. R. R. to have space for a spur track.

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Mayor Mauermann announced that the Council as a Committee of the Whole had taken a vote on the application of Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 8 for the City of San Antonio to handle the sewage of said district and by a vote of two to two had decided to reject said application and had so notified a representative of the District. Commissioner Anderson stated that his objection to the application was that he considered thirty years entirely too long a period for the contract to run. Commissioner Hein, who had not been available for the meeting of the Committee, objected to the rejection and said that he did not consider thirty years long enough. * (After Mr. Hein's objection Mayor Mauermann instructed the City Clerk to include in the Minutes of the meeting the fact that the application was

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refused.)*

The following bids were opened and read aloud and referred to the Purchasing Agent for tabulation:

Bids to furnish Projection Apparatus to the Health Department.

Bids to furnish Oxygen Breathing Apparatus and Extra Oxygen Cylinders to the Fire Department.

Bids to furnish four-wheeled trailer built to specifications for the Health Department.

Only one bid was received in answer to the advertisement for a camera for copying records or documents, with necessary equipment and supplies, that of Remington Rand, Inc. Since the Health Department has stated that the need for this equipment is urgent, Commissioner Anderson made a motion, which Commissioner Callaghan seconded, that this bid be accepted and an ordinance be authorized making a contract. The motion was carried by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein and Anderson; Nay, Steffler (Absent), and the ordinance prepared as follows:
