AN ORDINANCE

AMENDING CONTRACT BETWEEN BEXAR COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT
DISTRICT NO. 5 - SOUTH SAN ANTONIO - AND THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO
HANDLE THE SEWAGE OF SAID DISTRICT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO: AND BE IT RESOLVED BY THE
DIRECTORS OF BEXAR COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 5:-

1. That this instrument creates and manifests a change in the contract of the 23 of
May, 1936, between the City of San Antonio, of the County of Bexar and of the State of Texas,
hereinafter called City, and the Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 5 -
South San Antonio - of the County of Bexar and of the State of Texas, hereinafter called District,
so that the following paragraphs of said contract be changed to read as follows:- WITNESSETH:-

2. Paragraph 3 of said contract shall hereafter read as follows:-

"3. The District obligates itself to pay the City for this service at the office
of its License and Dues Collector for the term of 30 years, at the rate of \$20.00 for each
million gallons of sewage put into the city sewerage system at the point of connection; payments
to be made on the 1st day of October and the 1st day of April of each year during the term of
this contract. A minimum charge of \$30.00 per month will be paid by the District to the City
except when the meter registers a volume of discharge in excess of 50,000 gallons per day. The
District will pay the City \$480.00 upon the execution of this contract in compensation for the
minimum service charge from the 1 day of February 1937 to the 31 day of May 1938, inclusive."

3. Paragraph 12 of said contract shall hereafter read as follows:-

"12. The District covenants to indemnify and save the City whole and harmless
from any costs, expense, demands, or causes of action, real or asserted, or for any damage to
any person or property, caused by anything under this contract; and, on the failure of the
District to perform its obligation under this contract, then this contract shall end as to the
rights of the District as if by expiration of the term. When the volume of sewage passing
through the meter is more than 50,000 gallons per day, the District shall deliver a bond of
\$1500.00, with one surety which shall be a corporation authorized to do business in Texas, to the
City to guarantee the City against the failure of the District to pay the rate stipulated in this
contract."

4. This writing constitutes the entire contract between the parties hereto, there
being no other written nor any parol agreement with any officer or employee of the City of San
Antonio, it being understood that the Charter of San Antonio requires all contracts of the City
to be in writing and adopted by ordinance.

5. It is ordered by a two-thirds vote of the full Board of Commissioners of the City
of San Antonio that this ordinance shall receive final action without having been read at three
several meetings of the Commission.

ACCEPTING AN EASEMENT FOR STREET AT BURBANK HIGH SCHOOL, AND EXTENDING
EDWARDS STREET

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the resolution of the San Antonio Board of Education, of the 28th of July, 1937, is accepted, which grants the City a 36 foot easement for a public street around the Luther Burbank Vocational High School, which resolution is attached to this ordinance and made a part hereof.

GRANTING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AN EASEMENT FOR A STREET AT THE LUTHER
BURBANK VOCATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SAN ANTONIO BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SAN ANTONIO INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That this resolution manifests and creates the conveyance to the City of San Antonio for a 36 foot easement for a public street around the tract of land upon which the Luther Burbank Vocational High School is situated, said street beginning at Edwards Street on the south, running east to Boehmer Avenue, thence north to Fairmont Avenue, thence northwesterly along the property line of the school site to Edwards Street; according to a plat H-460, dated 27 February, 1931, on file in the office of the San Antonio City Engineer.

2. The City of San Antonio will grade and gravel said street, will grade and gravel a 36 foot loop drive-way at the south front of the auditorium, and will extend Edwards Street to Theo Avenue.

3. The aforesaid work to be done by the City of San Antonio will be finished on or before the 7 day of September, 1937.

AN ORDINANCE *OI-70*

DEMISING LAND TO JOHN W. KUSH IN THE OLMOS BASIN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this instrument creates and manifests the demise, for and in consideration of \$250.00, paid to the City of San Antonio by John W. Kush, of the County of Bexar and State of Texas, for the use for 99 years of Lot 1 and Lot 10, Block 60, of Alamo Heights, as a lawn, garden and drive-way.

2. No building shall be erected, nor shall anything which will float be put on this land, and the City of San Antonio reserves the right of entry at any time to inspect and to regulate the use of the described property to conform with this contract and to remove arbitrarily anything which the City Engineer declares to be an obstruction of the reservoir or which

might interfere with the Olmos Dam or its equipment; and the exercise of the rights conveyed shall be at the peril of the lessee, his heirs, assigns, successors, tenants and licensees, free from any liability, demands, or causes of action against the City of San Antonio or its successors for any loss, damage or destruction, all of which conditions, limitations and acquittances shall be covenants running with the land.

3. The lessee represents that he has examined the premises and that he understands that the premises are a part of the Olmos Flood Basin and may be flooded with water at any time; and acknowledges the title of the property in the City of San Antonio and will never assail or resist it.

4. The lessee will take good care of the property and suffer no waste and will keep it in good condition; and upon the termination of the use for which this grant is made, or on the breach of any condition contained herein, the rights herein contained shall cease and the right of possession revert into the City of San Antonio.

5. The foregoing instrument in writing constitutes the entire consideration for the conveyance, there being no other written nor any parol agreement with any officer or employee of the City, it being understood that the Charter of the City of San Antonio requires all contracts of the City to be in writing, and adopted by ordinance.

6. It is ordered by two-thirds vote of the full Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that this ordinance shall receive final action without having first been read at three several meetings of the Commission.

AN ORDINANCE ⁰¹⁻⁷⁴

CONFIRMING THE PERSONNEL OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the Police Department of the City of San Antonio shall consist of the persons whose names are included on the attached list which is made a part of this ordinance, and the various positions in said Department shall be filled by the person whose name is set opposite each of the positions therein specified.

2. Each of the persons appointed as a member of the Police Department in each of the positions specified is appointed for a period of 2 years for the term beginning on the 1 day of June, A. D. 1937 and expiring on the 31 day of May, A. D. 1939, under the terms of the Constitution and Laws of the State of Texas and the Charter and ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

3. The Mayor shall sign the commissions of all the persons appointed herein and all such commissions shall be attested by the City Clerk and they shall specify that they expire on the 31 day of May, A. D. 1939.

4. Every member of the police force of the City of San Antonio shall give a bond for the faithful performance of the duties of his office, executed by a solvent surety company authorized to do business in the State of Texas, to be selected by the policeman, in the sum of \$500.00; except the Chief of Police who shall give the required bond in the sum of \$5,000.00. The premium on the bond shall be paid by the City of San Antonio as part of the compensation of each of said policemen.

5. Said bond shall be kept in the custody of the Commissioner of Fire and Police and subject to public inspection during the regular hours of said Department.

6. It is ordered by two-thirds vote of the full Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that this ordinance shall receive final action without having first been read at three several meetings of the Commission.

AN ORDINANCE ⁰⁵⁻¹⁸

FOR PERMISSION TO USE THE CITY SANITARY SEWERS GRANTING THE PETITION OF
DAVID P. STEVES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the petition of David P. Steves, outside the City Limits of the City of San Antonio, for a license to use the sanitary sewerage system of the City of San Antonio thru means to be made by the Licensee, is granted hereby, subject to the following precedent conditions.

2. That the permit hereby granted is purely temporary and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice, for any reason that may in the judgement of the City be sufficient.

3. The Connection with the City Sewer to be made at the risk of the licensee to Lot 9, County Blk. 5588.

4. That this permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the property of the above mentioned petitioner, as same is now situated on said premises at Elden Road, near Elizabeth Road, outside of the City Limits, and no other person or persons shall be allowed or permitted, by the person to whom this permit is granted, his agents, servants or employees, to use the said City Sanitary Sewers thru the connection here permitted to be made.

5. That the future purchaser or owner of the above property mentioned in this ordinance, shall comply with all the provisions hereof.

6. That the use to be made of said sewer connection with the City sewerage system shall be subject to the regulation and direction of the City and no use shall be made hereof which might in any way impair the City sewer system or cause same to be obstructed or damaged in any manner whatsoever.

7. That in consideration of the permit hereby granted and the service to be rendered the said licensee hereunder, said grantee agrees to pay the City of San Antonio, as a rental charge, the schedule of fees fixed, and to be fixed, by the Ordinances of the City of San Antonio said rental commencing on the date of connection made with the City sanitary sewers, but in the event the permit hereby granted is cancelled for any reason, the pro rata amount of said rental shall be returned, less any expense incurred by the City in the premises.

8. That the inspectors of the City shall have free access to the grantee's premises and all buildings situated thereon during the continuance of this permit and while said premises are connected with said City sanitary sewers, for the purpose of inspecting the condition of the plumbing and the use of said sewers, and that all condition as herein embodied are being faithfully observed.

9. All expense incident to making this connection with the City sewers shall be borne by the petitioner, and the petitioner shall indemnify, hold and save harmless the City against any loss or damage of any character whatsoever incident to or caused by the use of the facilities here now granted.

10. This Ordinance shall become effective upon recording with the County Clerk of Bexar, and the returning of same to the City Clerk for filing as a permanent record, and the filing by the petitioner of a written acceptance of same with the City Clerk.

11. The City of San Antonio shall never be liable to the licensee for pecuniary damages for failure to take and treat the sewage, of the licensee, said right of action is waived as a part consideration of this permit:

AN ORDINANCE ⁰⁵⁻⁷⁹

FOR PERMISSION TO USE THE CITY SANITARY SEWERS GRANTING THE PETITION
OF ALBERT STEVES, 111.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the petition of Albert Steves, 111, outside the City Limits of the City of San Antonio, for a license to use the sanitary sewerage system of the City of San Antonio thru means to be made by the Licensee, is granted hereby, subject to the following precedent conditions.

2. That the permit hereby granted is purely temporary and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice, for any reason that may in the judgment of the City be sufficient.

3. The connection with the City sewer to be made at the risk of the licensee to Lot No. Four, County Block, 5526 Terrell Hills.

4. That this permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the property of the above mentioned petitioner, as same is now situated on said premises at Terrell Road, outside of the City Limits, and no other person or persons shall be allowed or permitted, by the person to whom this permit is granted, his agents, servants or employees, to use the said City sanitary sewers thru the connection here permitted to be made.

5. That the future purchaser or owner of the above property mentioned in this ordinance, shall comply with all the provisions hereof.

6. That the use to be made of said sewer connection with the City sewerage system shall be subject to the regulation and direction of the City and no use shall be made hereof which might in any way impair the City sewer system or cause same to be obstructed or damaged in any manner whatsoever.

7. AN ORDINANCE ⁰¹⁻⁹⁰

AMENDING SECTION ONE OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO PROMOTE THE HEALTH CONDITIONS OF THE CITY BY PROVIDING A CODE OF SANITARY REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PLACES, BUSINESS AND PERSONS WHEREIN OR BY WHOM FOOD-STUFFS OR DRINKS FOR HUMAN BEINGS IS PRODUCED, HANDLED, PREPARED, CARED FOR OR SOLD, AND ALL VEHICLES USED IN CONNECTION WITH ANY SUCH BUSINESS, FOR THE CONDUCT OF HOTELS AND LODGING HOUSES; AND PRESCRIBING THE PUNISHMENT FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE SEVERAL PROVISIONS HEREIN CONTAINED." PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 17TH DAY OF AUGUST, A.D. 1914.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That SECTION ONE of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to promote the health conditions of the City by providing a code of sanitary regulations and requirements for all places, business and persons wherein or by whom foodstuffs or drinks for human beings is produced, handled, prepared, cared for or sold, and all vehicles used in connection with any such business, for the conduct of hotels and lodging houses; and prescribing the punishment for the violation of the several provisions herein contained.", passed and approved on the 17th day of August, A.D. 1914, be, and the same is hereby amended so that there shall be added to SECTION ONE thereof, paragraph 31 reading as follows:

31. Any person, firm, association or corporation desiring to establish, operate or maintain a building, room or place where any poultry, fowls, rabbits or other game are killed, dressed, or otherwise submitted to any process leaving refuse, juices, or other refuse substances, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, must apply for and obtain a permit from the Board of Health to operate such business.

Every building, room or place where any poultry, fowls, rabbits or other game are killed, dressed, or otherwise submitted to any process, leaving refuse, juices, or other refuse substances must be approved by and conform to the standards and requirements prescribed by the Board of Health of the City of San Antonio, and shall comply strictly with the following:

(a) Killing and dressing rooms are to be equipped with cement floors and floor drains. These rooms are to have smooth washable walls and ceilings of cement plaster, metal lined, or of smooth material and must be painted.

(b) All walls and floors to be kept clean and free from blood, and entire premises to be kept free from refuse substances at all times.

(c) Killing and dressing rooms when in close proximity to where poultry, fowls, rabbits or other game are kept must be separated by walls or partitions.

(d) Any building or room where poultry, fowls, rabbits or other game are kept either in pens or batteries shall be equipped with cement floors that can be flushed out and drain into sanitary sewers.

(e) All pens or batteries located in the open and not in a building or room must be equipped with cement floors that can be flushed out and drain into sanitary sewers, and such pens or batteries shall not be located or installed within twenty-five (25) feet from any building or house being used for residential purposes.

(f) All walls other than those of killing and dressing rooms shall be constructed of smooth washable material.

(g) All floors, walls, ceilings, equipment and fixtures to be kept in good repair and capable of being properly cleaned.

(h) Every building, room or place shall be properly lighted, screened, ventilated, and having an ample and convenient supply of running water.
