

AN ORDINANCE **08-106**

Amending Section 1 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance providing a method of inspecting animals intended for slaughter and sale in the markets of San Antonio, and fixing penalties for the violation thereof", passed October 8th, 1906, recorded in Book "D", pages 147 et seq. of the ordinance records of the City of San Antonio, so as to enlarge the limits/^{fixed}for the establishment of slaughtering pens.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That Section 1 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance providing a method of inspecting animals intended for slaughter and sale in the markets of San Antonio, and fixing penalties for the violation thereof", passed October 8, 1906, recorded in Book D, page 147 et seq. of ordinance records of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

Section 1. Beginning at the intersection of the south boundary line of the City on the Somerset Road; thence northeasterly with the line of Somerset Road to the newly established south or west line of the San Pedro - Alazan ditch; thence westward and northward with the west line of said ditch with its meanders to the right of way of the Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway Company; thence in a westerly direction with the said right of way to the west line of South San Marcos Street; thence northward with the west line of South San Marcos Street to the South line of Laredo Street; thence westward with the south line of Laredo Street to its intersection with the right of way of the International & Great Northern Railway Company; thence southwestward along said right of way to a point to intersect with the south line of Medio Street; thence westward with the south line of Medio Street to the west line of South Colorado Street; thence north with the west line of South Colorado Street to the south line of Tampico Street; thence west with the south line of Tampico Street to South Zarzamora Street; thence with the east line of South Zarzamora Street to the south line of the Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway Company's right of way; thence in a westerly direction with the said south line of said Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railway Company's right of way to the city limits; thence in a southerly direction with the west boundary line of the city to the southwest corner thereof; thence easterly with the south boundary line of the city to the place of the beginning.

AN ORDINANCE **88-107**

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED MARCH 14, 1904, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF MARKETS FOR THE SALE OF MEAT WITHIN SIX BLOCKS OF THE CITY MARKET HOUSE".

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That Section One and Section Two of an Ordinance, passed and approved on March 14, 1904, entitled, "An Ordinance prohibiting the establishment of markets for the sale of meat within six blocks of the City Market House", be and the same are hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit:-

SECTION ONE: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons or corporation to establish a meat market where the carcasses or parts of carcasses of animals are sold, or offered for sale, within the following boundaries, namely:-

Beginning at the intersection of the centre lines of West Salinas and North Frio Streets;

Thence southerly along the centre lines of North and South Frio Streets to the intersection with the centre line of Durango Street;

Thence easterly along the centre line of Durango Street to its intersection with the centre line of South Laredo Street;

Thence southerly along the centre line of South Laredo Street to its intersection with the centre line of Durango Street extending easterly from South Laredo Street;

Thence easterly along the centre line of said Durango Street to the centre line of San Pedro Creek;

Thence northerly along the centre line of the San Pedro Creek to a point thirty (30) feet south of Dolorosa Street in City Block No. One Hundred and Eleven (111);

Thence easterly along a line parallel to and thirty (30) feet South of the south line of Dolorosa Street through City Blocks Nos. One Hundred and Eleven (111) and One Hundred (100), to a point in the centre line of Dwyer Avenue;

Thence northerly along the centre line of Dwyer Avenue (extended) to a point in the centre line of Soledad Street at its intersection with West Commerce Street;

Thence northerly along the centre line of Soledad Street to its intersection with the centre line of West Houston Street;

Thence westerly along the centre line of West Houston Street to its intersection with the centre line of Main Avenue;

Thence northerly along the centre line of Main Avenue to its intersection with the centre line of West Salinas Street;

Thence westerly along the centre line of West Salinas Street to the place of beginning;

All within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas.

SECTION TWO: Any person or persons or corporation violating any of the provisions of the preceding Section, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, and each and every day shall constitute a separate offence.

AN ORDINANCE *08-108*

APPROVING THE BOND OF THE CITY NATIONAL BANK AS DEPOSITORY FOR THE SAN ANTONIO WATER WORKS SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the bond of the CITY NATIONAL BANK OF San Antonio, Texas, selected by the Water Works Board of Trustees as depository of the funds under control of said Board, with W. W. COLLIER, FREDERICK TERRELL, R. F. SPENCER, HARRY H. ROGERS AND W. R. KING, as sureties, in the sum of FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$500,000.00) DOLLARS, approved by the said Water Works Board of Trustees by resolution of September 22, 1925, be and the same is hereby approved.

BOND OF DEPOSITORY FOR

THE SAN ANTONIO WATER-WORKS SYSTEM.

THE STATE OF TEXAS,
COUNTY OF BEXAR.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, THAT we, CITY NATIONAL BANK, as principal, and FREDERICK TERRELL, HARRY H. ROGERS, R. F. SPENCER, W. W. COLLIER AND W. R. KING, as sureties, are held unto and acknowledge ourselves firmly bound to pay to the City of San Antonio, the sum of FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$500,000.00) Dollars, for the payment of which well and truly to be made at the office of the City Treasurer in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, we bind ourselves, our heirs, successors, executors and administrators, jointly severally, by these presents.

THE CONDITIONS OF THIS OBLIGATION, are such, that whereas the above bounden principal has been selected by the Water-Works Board of Trustees, of the City of San Antonio, Texas, as a depository of the funds under control of said Water-Works Board of Trustees, under the terms and provisions of the proposal of said above bounden principal and the resolutions, regulations and rules of said Water-Works Board of Trustees, and the Charter and Ordinances of said City, all of which are made a part of this obligation; THEREFORE, if the said above bounden principal shall well and faithfully perform all the duties and obligations devolving upon it, as such depository, by law or contract, and shall well and truly pay upon presentation, all checks and warrants properly drawn upon it, against any such fund or funds applicable to the payment of such checks and warrants, and if all funds and moneys so deposited shall and will be faithfully kept and with the interest thereon, properly and correctly disbursed, paid over and accounted for according to law or contract with said Water-Works Board of Trustees, and the rules, resolutions and regulations thereof, then this obligation shall be and become null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

Exclusive venue in all litigation growing out of this bond, is laid in the State Courts of Bexar County, Texas.

And it is further agreed by all parties hereto, including sureties, that this bond shall be held to be an independent common law obligation in accordance with its face and tenor, as well as a bond required by statute, charter and ordinance; and all proceedings and prerequisites herein recited or required by law as preliminaries to the selection of such depository shall be conclusively presumed to have been duly and regularly had and performed before the execution of this bond; wholly regardless of defects or omissions, if any, in such preliminaries; and that at the time when this bond is presented for approval the names of all sureties expected to join in this bond appear as signatories hereto.
