TEXAS, SAID TRACT KNOWN AS COLISEUM PARK SUBDIVISON AND CONSISTING OF 31.38 ACRES OF LAND MORE OR LESS.

BE IT ORAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the bounds and limits of the City of San Antonio are hereby changed and fixed and the extension thereof provided for and additional territory fixed and the extension thereof provided for and additional territory lying adjacent to said City, said area being a tract of land located in the eastern part of the City south of U.S. Highway 90 and east of the MK& T.R.R., being a tract out of OCL 1, Range 1, District 1, and OCL 2, Range 1, District 1, also out of portion "E: of the land of Mathilda Barkmeyer in Bexar County, Texas, said tract known as Coliseum Park Subdivision Unit 2, and consisting of 31,38 acres of land, more or less, is annexed; and the present bounds and limits of said City are changed so as to include all of the territory described hereby, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, which annexed territory is described and included, as follows to-wit:

2. Beginning at a point in the present City Limits line, which is also the north line of Aransas Ave., and the Old City Tract Line, at it's intersectio with the east line of Spriggsdale Blvd., in Coliseum Park Subdivision, for the southwest corner of the tract herein described; Thence northwesterly with the east line of Spriggsdale Blvd., and the present City Limits line; Thence continuing with the east line of Spriggsdale Blvd., 1224.98 ft., more or less, to a point on the south line of U. S. Highway 90 for the northwest corner of this tract; Thence northeasterly with the south line of U.S. Highway 90, 752.42 ft., more or less, to a point on the west line of Gay Blvd., in Coliseum Park Subdivision for the northeast corner of this tract; Thence southeasterly with the west line of Gay Blvd., 1550.22 ft., more or less to a point on the north line of Aransas Ave., which line is also the Old City Tract Line, for the southeast corner of this tract; Thence southwesterly 775.53 ft., more or less, with the north line of Aransas Ave., and Old City Tract Line to the place of beginning. for which the City is Justly liable upon annexation to the City.

That the additional territory and area so annexed, shall be a part of the City of San Antonio, and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all rights and privileges of all the other citizens of the City of San Antonio; and shall be bound by the acts ordinances and regulations of the City of San Antonio.

6. That the City Engineer shall change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds and limits of the City of San Antonio, as changed and fixed by this ordinance.

7. The City Assessor shall change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds and limits, and shall proceed to assess and collect taxes on the property included in the new bounds and limits for the next fiscal year, as provided by the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

8. After the introduction of this Ordinance and after it has been amended as desired by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, for final passage, it shall be published in the "Commercial Recorder", in the City of San Antonio, one time; and shall not be passed finally thereafter until at least thirty days have elapsed after said publication.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the petition of Bibb Bros., for a license to use the sanitary sewerage system of the City of San Antonio is granted hereby subject to the following precedent conditions.

2. That the permit hereby granted is temporary and the City reserves the right to revoke same at any time, with or without notice.

3. The house plumbing and the connection with the City sewer shall be made and maintained at the cost and risk of the Licensee in conformity with the ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

4. That this permit is intended to cover only the sewerage from the property of the Licensee, as same is now situated on said premises at Number 108 Arvin Drive E. .44 ft of Lot 3 & W. 48 ft of Lot 4. Co. Block 5846 (Laurelwood Add'n.) Terrell Hills and no other person shall be permitted to use the said City sanitary sewers through the connection hereby made.

5. That the future owner of the above property shall comply with all the provisions hereof and the conditions are covenants running with the land.

AN ORDINANCE MAKING A FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT TO, AND ADDING SECTION "E" TO ARTICLE I SECTION "3" TO ARTICLE VII OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO EXECUTE AN INDENTURE OF LEASE WITH TRANS-TEXAS AIRWAYS, INC., FOR THE USE OF THE SAN ANTONIO MUNICIPAL AIRPORT AND FACILITIES."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

This Agreement, made this 24th day of May, 1951, between the CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, a municipal corporation of Bexar County, Texas (hereinafter referred to as "Lessor"), and Trans-Texas Airways, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Texas (hereinafter referred to as "Lessee").

W I T N E S S E T H

WHEREAS, on the 1st day of February, 1950 Lessor and Lessee executed that certain Indenture of Lease (hereinafter called the "Airport Agreement"), under which, among things, Lessor granted to Lessee the use of certain premises at the San Antonio Municipal Airport (hereinafter called the "Airport"): and,

WHEREAS, Lessee now wishes to occupy exclusive space in the present terminal building at the Airport and the parties desire to amend the Airport Agreement to provide for the leasing of certain premises therein to lessee:

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the rents, covenants and agreements contained herein and in said Airport Agreement, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Effective as of the date of occupancy by Lessee of the premises in the present terminal building, the Airport Agreement dated February 1, 1950, shall be amended by the addition of Section "E" to Article 1 of said agreement as follows:

I "E" EXCLUSIVE SPACE. The exclusive use of the following areas:

181.85 sq. feet of ticket counter and office space located in the southeast corner of the Terminal Building, as designated in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof. Lessor contemplated the erection of a new Terminal Building. Upon completion of same, Lessee will be assigned appropriate space therein, upon terms to be agreed upon, in lieu of the space above described.

200 sq. ft. of space in the Baggage and Cargo Building adjacent to the present Terminal Building, the exact location to be determined by mutual agreement of Lessee and Lessor: all for such uses as Lessee may desire to make thereof in connection with or incidental to its operation of an air transportation system. Subject to the approval of the Director of Airports, the lessee shall have the right and option at any time and from time to time during the term hereof, and of any extension or renewal, to lease, for the exclusive use of itself or of any air transport company subsidiary to or affiliated with it, any additional space at the Airport not necessary to the Lessor's operation of the Airport and at the time not leased to others, whether such space is adjacent to the space leased hereunder or otherwise, together with any or all rights, facilities, licenses and privileges appurtenant to such space and to the Airport, upon the same general terms and conditions as are herein established."

2. Said Airport Agreement shall be amended by the addition of Section "3" to article VII of said agreement as follows:

"3. (a) A charge of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per square foot per year for Lessee's exclusive space in the New Terminal Building.
(181.85 sq. feet at \$2.00 per year --- \$30.31 per month).

(b) A charge of Seventy-Five Cents (0.75) per square foot per year for Lessee's exclusive space in the Baggage and Cargo Building.
(200 square feet at 0.75 per year -- \$12.50 per month)."

Said Airport Agreement dated February 1, 1950 as herein expressly amended, shall remain fully effective in accordance with the terms and conditions thereof.

1. That the proposal of National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, dated the 24th day of June 1951, to act as depository of the City of San Antonio, all of which is more fully set out in said instrument attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof for all intents and purposes as fully as if it were copied herein, be and the same is hereby accepted.

2. That said Bank be and is hereby designated as general depository, and as special depository, of said City, and upon deposit of securities approved by the City to secure the City funds, duly authorized and eligible to receive the general deposits and the special deposits of the City of San Antonio for the fiscal years beginning June 1, 1951 and ending May 31, 1953.

3. That said Bank be and it is hereby designated as fiscal agent for said City.

4. That the offer of said Bank, subject to the conditions therein stated, to lend to the City of San Antonio for its use, in anticipation of the receipts of taxes levied for the current fiscal year and the current revenue for said fiscal year, the amounts, and upon the terms stated in said offer, be and the same is hereby accepted.

5. That the said Bank be and it is hereby declared to be authorized and eligible to lend money for the use of the City of San Antonio in anticipation of the receipts of taxes levied for the fiscal years beginning June 1st., 1951, and ending May 31, 1953, and the current revenue for said fiscal years as authorized and provided by the Charter of said City; and all uncollected taxes and current revenues of the City of San Antonio for the fiscal years 1951 to 1952 except revenue from Parking Meters, Health Center Project, Willow Springs Golf Course Project, and all uncollected back taxes for previous years subject only to existing prior valid pledges of said back taxes are hereby irrevocably pledged to secure such loans.
