

A RESOLUTION

DECLARING THE CANVASS AND THE RESULT OF A SPECIAL ELECTION ON THE 15 OF OCTOBER 1935 TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS WHO OWN TAXABLE PROPERTY IN SAID CITY AND WHO HAVE DULY RENDERED THE SAME FOR TAXATION, FIVE SEPARATE PROPOSITIONS TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF THE CITY AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF THE CITY FOR PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR SAID CITY, AS FOLLOWS: (A) \$300,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT A COLISEUM IN ROOSEVELT PARK; (B) \$130,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT A STADIUM IN SAN JACINTO PARK; (C) \$50,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT MONUMENTS IN PUBLIC PLACES; (D) \$10,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT ADDITION TO WITTE MUSEUM; (E) \$10,000.00 TO CONSTRUCT PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS IN THE SUNKEN GARDEN.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. Came on this the 16 day of October, 1935, the day after the special election to borrow money on the credit of the City of San Antonio and to issue bonds of the City for permanent public improvements in and for said City, regularly to be canvassed, the returns of the special municipal election held on the 15 day of October 1935, at which election there was submitted to the qualified voters who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, five separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of the City and to issue bonds of the City for permanent public improvements in and for said City as fully set out in the Ordinance ordering said election passed and approved on the 29 of August 1935 and as set out in the Proclamation and Notice of Election promulgated by the Mayor on the 29 day of August 1935 posted at the several voting places in the 105 precincts in said City and published in the San Antonio Light, as required by law, and the Mayor and Commissioners having met to canvass the returns and to declare the result of said election in the manner provided by law, and after considering, determining and canvassing all the matters of fact thereto appertaining;

2. We, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, do hereby find and declare the result of said election to be as tabulated and attached hereto and made a part of this instrument by reference as fully as if the same were copied herein;

3. And it appearing to the Board of Commissioners that said propositions were submitted and that the special election was held and was conducted as required by the Statutes of the State of Texas and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio; and, that at said special election there was cast on each proposition submitting a proposition to borrow money on the credit of the City of San Antonio and to issue bonds for permanent public improvements, the aggregate number of votes marked "YES" and the aggregate number of votes marked "NO", all as shown by the report and the canvass of said returns by the Board of Commissioners, and said returns having been found to be correct in all respects, it is declared that Proposition (A) was not adopted by a majority vote, that Proposition (B) was not adopted by a majority vote,

that Proposition (C) was not adopted by a majority vote, that Proposition (D) was not adopted by a majority vote, and that Proposition (E) was not adopted by a majority vote, of the qualified voters at said election.

4. PASSED AND APPROVED AND ADOPTED this the 16 day of October, A.D. 1935.
