

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AUGUST 9TH, 1915.

AT FOUR O'CLOCK P. M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners, Garland, Lambert Kearny and Steves.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING WERE ORDERED APPROVED.

MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS.

The invitation from the play-grounds was read and accepted.

The petition for better lighting of Market Square was read and referred to the Commissioner of Police & Fire.

The petition of the Lone Star Brewery for paving Jones Avenue and Grand Avenue was read and ordered filed.

The petition of Rev. C. T. Wright, for permit to erect Gospel Tent on Nebraska Street between Mesquite & Hackberry Street, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Police & Fire, Steves.

The petition of Edmond B. Pauley for reduction of Street Paving Assessment, on Peach Street, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements, Kearny.

The petition of the Woman's Club, re-Enforcement of Corral Ordinances, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Sanitation of Parks & Public Property, Lambert.

The petition of the Mothers Council for enforcement of Corral Ordinances was read and referred to the Commissioner of Sanitation, Parks & Public Property.

The petition of the Fox Company, to erect Electric Sign at #205 Alamo Plaza, was read and referred to the Commissioner of Fire & Police, Steves.

The petition of the Quick Service Tire Company, to erect illuminated bulletins at #128 & #129 Ave "D", was read and referred to the Commissioner of Fire and Police, Steves.

Commissioner of Fire & Police Steves recommended that the petition of A. S. Wilstead and William Christoph to transfer Auto License to Jitney License be granted, and that applicants made regular Jitney application and file bond. Adopted.

Commissioner Steves recommended that the petition of E. G. Collins, re-Electrical Ordinance, that action be taken on pending ordinance as soon as possible. Adopted.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Four Thousand Five Hundred (4,500.00) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Street Paving Fund to pay Warfield & Green for additional work done on River Avenue Culverts.

MA-104 AN ORDINANCE.
Appropriating \$6,500.00 to pay W. A. Kelly Company.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Six Thousand Five Hundred (\$6,500.00) Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund to pay W. A. Kelly Company, Contractors, on drain ditches through Brackenridge Park.

MA-105 AN ORDINANCE.

MA-106 AN ORDINANCE.

Appropriating \$3.75 to pay Frank Lewis for mule sold from City Pond.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Three (\$3.75) Dollars and Seventy-Five Cents be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund to pay Frank Lewis balance left from the sale of one mule from City Pond, after deducting pond fees.

MA-107 AN ORDINANCE.

Appropriating \$100.00 to pay Southwell Construction Company.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund to pay the Southwell Construction Company for constructing sidesalk on the south side of Travis Park.

MA-108 AN ORDINANCE.

Making change in assessment for paving on Travis Street in front of South part of Lot No. 8, New City Block No. 154.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the City of San Antonio does hereby assume the payment of one third of the assessment for paving Travis Street in front of South part of Lot No. 8, New City Block No. 154, said lot being the property of Wm. Dobrowsky, and being of triangular shape, and very narrow.

NOW THEREFORE, be it further ordained that the sum of One Hundred and Seventy Five (\$175.28) Dollars and Twenty-Eight Cents be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the Street Paving Fund to pay one third of said assessment. (The total assessment against said property being \$525.86.)

Commissioner Garland introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll-call, to-wit: Ayes, Brown, Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Steves. Nays, None.

MA-109 AN ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That there be and there is hereby appropriated out of the 1914 General Fund, the following sum of money for the hereinafter designated purpose: Three (\$3.90) Dollars and Ninety Cents (the school portion being \$1.25) warrant for which is to be made payable to Thomas Webb, on account of erroneous assessment and collection of taxes for the fiscal year 1914; on Lots Numbers 13 to 15, in New City Block No. 863, on valuation of \$320.00.

Commissioner Kearny introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted, by the following vote on roll-call, to-wit: Ayes; Brown, Garland, Kearny and Steves. Nays, None.

MA-110 AN ORDINANCE.

Appropriating \$13,000.00 out of the 1915 General Fund for Storm and Sanitary Sewer Work.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000.00) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund for the purpose of paying for the completion of the Grove Avenue Storm Sewer, Cherry Street Storm Sewer, and Cherry Street Intersecting Sanitary Sewer, which are contracts that the City has with the Wm. Schuwirth & Company, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to draw warrants against said appropriations

for the purpose of paying for the work done on the said contracts.

Commissioner Kearny introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by unanimous vote of Commissioners.

MA-111 AN ORDINANCE

Ordering the laying of sidewalks, etc., on various Streets, under the penalties for failure to comply with said order.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WHEREAS the City Commissioners in the exercise of the Police Power, finds and hereby declares a public necessity for the laying of sidewalks, etc., as hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS by an ordinance heretofore on the 10th day of August, A.D., 1914, passed and approved this City Commissioners provided for such cases; said ordinance being entitled "An Ordinance prescribing specifications for Sidewalks and Curbing for Public Streets and Places, and Providing Measures to Compel the Laying, Construction and Repair of the Same by Owners of Abutting Property; Requiring the Cost Thereof to be paid by the Owners of such property and Declaring such Cost a Personal Liability of such owners, and a First and Prior Lien and Charge against such Property; and Prescribing the Manner of Ordering and Compelling the Construction of such Work, and the Punishment for Failure to Comply with such Orders," and proceeding hereupon in accordance with said previous ordinance which is made a part hereof;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED:

Section One. That the construction of cement sidewalks be and the same is hereby ordered along or in front of the entire extent of each parcel of the property and premises hereinafter described, and that the owners of such premises proceed immediately to construct said improvements, or to cause same to be constructed at their cost and expense, on the streets or public places hereinafter named; the respective premises herein referred to, the owner or owners thereof to whom this order is addressed and each such respective street or public place being as follows, to-wit:

Section Two: That said improvements shall be constructed promptly in accordance with the specifications and other provisions contained insaid ordinance of August 10th, 1914, and that said work shall be commenced within thirty days after the service of notice on this order, and that said notices shall be given and all other things shall be done as therein provided; and that for failure to comply with or violation of this order, any person, association of persons or corporation found guilty of such offense shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, all under and as in said ordinance of August 10th, 1914, provided.

Commissioner Kearny introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

that the tabulation dated July 29th, 1915, made by the City Engineer, hereto attached, and made a part hereof, showing the difference in cost of paving Lafitte Street, Sycamore Street, Santa Clara Street and Plum Street with brick or wood blocks instead of Asphaltic Concrete, said extra cost to be paid by the Galveston Harrisburg and San Antonio Railway Company is hereby adopted and that the City Clerk is hereby directed to furnish a copy of this resolution to said Railway Company.

Dear Sir:

I return herewith letter from Mr. R. C. Watkins, Superintendent of the G. H. & S. A. Ry. of July 19th, attached to yours of July 26th, referring to portions of pavement to be paid by the Railway Company on Sycamore and other Streets.

Referring to the last one, beg to advise that the first statement sent you gave the difference of costs of the different pavements for the entire areas of the streets.

Mr. Watkins statement as to difference of cost is practically correct when the street intersections and portions of Plum Street between Dakota and Victoria Street are excluded.

I figure the excess cost as follows:

Vitrified Brick, - - - - -	\$5758.93
3" Wood Blocks, - - - - -	10808.27
3½" Wood Blocks, - - - - -	12969.92

and is based upon the following rates.

Asphaltic Concrete,	\$1.90	per square yard.
Brick (as assessed)	2.57	" " "
3" Wood Blocks,	3.15	" " "
3½" Wood Blocks,	3.40	" " "

I take the difference between the excess cost quoted by Mr. Watkins and myself is caused by that I have more accurate data as to the length and widths of the Streets.
