Mr. Gonzalez was then called on for his ordinance which would regulate the processing of ordinances. He replied that it was not yet ready and that he would send each member a copy so that it might be read by them before presentation.

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Mr. Gonzalez then went into his report on the use of parks for horseback riding. He stressed the great danger and urgency for immediate action. He suggested that a committee of three members of the council be appointed to seek out a remedy for the situation. Mr. Winton suggested that he thought it should be the function of the City Manager, Park Director and City Attorney. Mr. Gonzalez insisted that a committee would be in order and moved that one be appointed. After the motion carried, the Chair appointed Mr. Gonzalez, Mr. Baines and Mr. Friedrich.

On roll call this motion was carried by the following vote: AYES, Friedrich, Crumrine, Kuykendall, Olivares, Daniels, Gonzalez; NAYS, Baines; NOT VOTING, Passur and Winton.

An ordinance to prohibit riding of horses in city parks was next introduced and, after discussion, was passed by the following vote: AYES, Friedrich, Baines, Passur, Kuykendall, Gonzalez; NAYS, Crumrine, Olivares, Daniels; NOT VOTING, Winton. After the ordinance was declared passed, discussion ensued and a motion to reconsider the vote by which it was passed was made by Mr. Gonzalez, seconded by Mr. Friedrich, and was unanimously carried. The ordinance was then handed to the City Attorney for alteration and was re-presented as follows and was unanimously adopted.


AN ORDINANCE 21,233

MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO RIDE OR PERMIT ANOTHER TO RIDE A HORSE UPON OR ACROSS ANY PAVED STREET BORDERING OR WITHIN THE LIMITS OF ANY MUNICIPAL PARK OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR
