THURSDAY, JUNE 3rd, A.D.1920, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Coy, Lambert, Heuermann and Wright.

RESOLUTION.

Calling for bids for the construction of Fire Stations.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and he is hereby directed to advertize for bids to erect Police and Fire Department station buildings, as follows:

1st. One two story addition to Central Police and Fire Station, of brick, hollow tile and concrete construction for machine shop and garage for Police Department.

2nd. One two story Fire Department Station of brick, hollow tile and concrete construction, to be located on the north side of East Commerce Street, between Mesquite Street and Hackberry Street.

3rd. One two story Fire Department Station of brick, hollow tile and concrete construction, to be located at the northwest corner of Richmond Avenue and Camden Streets.

4th. One two story Fire Department Station of brick, hollow tile and concrete construction, to be located on the West side of San Marcos Street, between Leal and Ruiz Street.

5th. One two story Fire Department station of brick, hollow tile and concrete construction to be located on the west side of Sommerset Road, opposite the intersection of Pruitt Avenue.

All proposals to be filed with the City Clerk on or before 4 o'clock p.m. on June 10, 1920.

No. 15 AN ORDINANCE *-537*


Appropriating expenses for the formal opening of Laf-A-Lot Camp at Comfort, Texas, June 1, 1920.


A resolution submitted by the Educational Department of San Antonio Organized Labor, protesting against the discharge of City firemen, was read and ordered filed.
