PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Coy, Heuermann, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

MC-849 AN ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio, in accordance with the plan heretofore adopted, is desirous of widening the channel of Alazan Creek to a uniform width of sixty feet: and

WHEREAS, plats and specifications have been drawn in accordance with said plan, affecting the property of A.Siman and others in City Blocks 2309 and 2310;Therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That A. Siman is authorized to construct a retaining wall, at his expense, on the lines of the creek as furnished by the Engineers office; this permission being as a part consideration for the land necessary for said widening, for which deeds have been prepared and executed by the said A.Siman to said City, and which deeds are hereby accepted.
