

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 1966, at 8:30 A.M.

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The meeting was called to order by the Presiding Officer W. W. McAllister with the following members present: McALLISTER, CALDERON, JONES, JAMES, COCKRELL, GATTI, TREVINO, PARKER and BREMER; Absent: NONE.

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66-1044 The invocation was given by Councilman Dr. Calderon.

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The minutes of the meeting of August 25, 1966 were approved.

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66-1044 Mayor McAllister presented the following Citation to Dr. Leo Galindo.

DR. LEO GALINDO

"In grateful acknowledgement of valuable and distinguished service to the community as a member of the Board of Trustees of the San Antonio Public Library from September 9, 1959 to August 25, 1966.

Dr. Galindo gave full measure of his time and talents in the difficult and responsible position during which time the library system has seen its greatest expansion, thus contributing greatly to the educational and cultural development of the City for which all our citizens are deeply grateful."

Mr. Steve Taylor, Planning Director, briefed the Council on the proposed annexation.

The Mayor returned to the meeting.

66-1044 Mrs. Victor Farias, 2333 East Crockett, read the following letter to the Council.

"Re: Traffic light signal at intersection of Clark & Nebraska Sts.

To whom it may concern:

We, as representatives of parent's of children of Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, 2101 Nebraska Street, San Antonio, Texas, request and present our petition for a signal light at the intersection of Clark and Nebraska Streets.

We have submitted other petitions which have been disregarded. On August 31, 1966, 8:30 a.m., a little girl, on her way to school, was struck and hurt approximately one block from our school. On October 21, 1963, a little boy was struck and killed in front of our school.

There have been numerous minor and major accidents at this intersection. There was a bad accident about six weeks ago in which a young man was killed - and many more. So, in the interest of our children and all children, we the undersigned request and petition for a traffic signal light at the intersection of Clark and Nebraska Streets.

The Mayor thanked Mrs. Farias and instructed the Traffic Department to investigate the matter and report to the Council the following week.

66-998 Mrs. Cockrell gave a report of the Council committee on the historic structures to be retained in the HemisFair area.

She stated that the Council committee had met with the Conservation Society and the HemisFair Executive Committee.

The report recommended the Schultze House be released for demolition subject to the following provisions.

1. Prior to demolition, City of San Antonio will photograph, measure, and record floor plan of the house.
2. Conservation Society will provide list of features it suggests be saved. This will definitely include the ornamental tin work.
3. Urban Renewal will let demolition contract subject to City's request; such contract will provide for the aforementioned architectural details to become property of the City of San Antonio.
4. If City releases such architectural details to Conservation Society, Mrs. Alfred Negley agrees to provide for storage of same.

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5. All work is to be accomplished prior to September 15th.

6. It was understood to be the wish and hope of all concerned that the Schultze House could be reconstructed within a reasonable length of time. Two sites suggested were:

a. On Goliad Street to fill a vacancy when the temporary modules housing international exhibits are removed,

b. In the expansion of LaVillita at a location where the architect suggests that a structure be added.

66-1047 Mrs. Barbara Lockett representing the Conservation Society requested more time be given before the Council directs the Urban Renewal Agency to demolish the Schultze home. She stated the Society was contacting house movers who specialize in moving historic homes and that additional time was needed since the concerns were out of town.

After further discussion, the Mayor stated that he will personally contact Mr. James Gaines, HemisFair and the Urban Renewal Agency so they will delay the signing of any contract until Monday, in fact, if bids are called for demolition work, it will be some time before they would be opened.

The Clerk read the following resolution.

66-1044 The Mayor stated that last Sunday, he had an occasion to attend the ground-breaking ceremony for Councilman James' new church, and complimented Councilman James on the service.

The Mayor then recognized Reverend Avery from Oakland, California, who was also present at the ground-breaking services.

Reverend Avery presented the Mayor with a program of religious services he was conducting and invited the Mayor and Members of the Council to attend.

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66-1044 The Mayor presented a proclamation for "Crusade for Child Safety Month" to Mr. C. E. Pratt, Vice President of the San Antonio Safety Council.

66-1044 Rev. C. Ramsey, Willow Park Addition, complained to the Council that various people were dumping debris in the Salado Creek area adjoining the Willow Park subdivision. He stated after investigation, it was found that the Texas Home Improvement Company owned the property and the debris was coming from contractors working on the Expressway.

Assistant City Manager, Gerald Henckel, reported that he was familiar with the situation and that it was very unsightly and that it would take several years to fill the cavity.

After investigation by the Council, Mr. Henckel was instructed to see if he could get the owner to agree to level the debris to make it more presentable.

* * *

66-677 Mrs. Harry Guynes, 819 McKinley, reported to the Council that the batching plants were still operating in the McKinley area and that Mr. McCreless had told her there was no transfer of property to the State, in other words the batching plants were operating on private property.

Mr. Henckel, Assistant City Manager, explained that he had talked to two companies concerned regarding using McKinley Street.

After discussion by the Council, Mr. Henckel was directed to see if he couldn't work out a more satisfactory answer to this problem.

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66-526 After a short recess the meeting reconvened at 10:00 a.m., and the Mayor declared the public hearing on Central West Project 1, an Urban Renewal Project, TEX. R-39 and the Urban Renewal Plan as amended and proposed by the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of San Antonio.

The Mayor stated the purpose of the hearing is to consider an amendment number three to the Urban Renewal Plan as previously approved and amended in order to include among the permitted uses in the redevelopment of said project area by private enterprise, the construction of transient housing including apartments, hotels and motels, and to make the remaining land available for redevelopment by private enterprise and public agencies as authorized by law.

Mr. Winston Martin, Director of Urban Renewal, explained that this amendment came about due to interest of parties in acquiring land in the project area for transient housing. Before this use could be allowed, an independent study had to be made. The study has now been made and indicates there is a need for transient housing and the amendment allows this use in the project area.

The Mayor inquired if any citizens or organizations or spokesmen for organizations desired to be heard.

No one wishing to speak on the matter, the Mayor declared the hearing to be closed.

66-947 The Mayor called to order the public hearing scheduled for 10:00 a.m., on the proposed Rosa Verde Urban Renewal Project, TEX. R-78, and the Urban Renewal Plan therefore, as proposed by the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of San Antonio.

The Mayor stated the purpose of the hearing is to consider the proposal for the undertaking of Rosa Verde Project TEX. R-78 to redevelop a portion of the City of San Antonio adjacent to the central business district by acquiring land in the Project area; demolishing and removing certain buildings and improvements which are in the slum condition; establishing certain rehabilitation standards for property in a deteriorating and blighted condition not to be acquired; installing, constructing, and reconstructing certain streets, utilities, public places and other Project improvements; making land available after acquisition for certain public purposes, namely, redevelopment by the City of San Antonio and other political subdivisions of the State of Texas and also making land available for redevelopment by private enterprise as authorized by law.

Mr. Winston Martin, Director of Urban Renewal, stated this was in essence the same plan previously approved by the Urban Renewal Agency and which was heard by the Council at a public hearing on April 14, 1966. He stated since that time that it has been requested that the eastern boundary be extended from the San Pedro Creek to Cameron Street, which would make it possible for the City to complete some street construction at West Commerce and Houston Street, and eliminate some difficulty with reference to traffic movement at these points.

He added that this plan added some eighteen parcels of land which for the most part are designated for rehabilitation, and one other change was that it will allow an added land use for transient housing, made possible by the independent study which indicated there was a need for it.

Mr. Martin then filed a copy of the Rosa Verde Urban Renewal Plan dated August 25, 1966. He reviewed the documents prepared by the Urban Renewal Agency concerning the history of the plan, structural conditions in the area, adequate public facilities, health conditions, police-fire incidents, housing conditions and relocation data plus tax revenue facts. He described the project area, the land uses existing in the area, the conditions of the properties in the area, the percentage of standard, rehabilitable and sub-standard structures, the plan for high rise apartments, the plan for widening Santa Rosa Avenue to six lanes, the redevelopment of the public market, the opportunity for expansion of the Santa Rosa Medical Center and the plan to restrict Laredo Street to a service street. In making the presentation, Mr. Martin referred to the following exhibits; boundary map, land use map, and land acquisition map.

The Mayor then asked for those in favor or opposed desiring to be heard, and the following speakers made presentations as follows.

Mr. James B. Graves opposed the Rosa Verde Project, especially in the widening of Santa Rosa Street north of Dolorosa. He stated that he owned three pieces of property in the Rosa Verde, all of which had been in his family since approximately 1871 and that two pieces of property, the Chapa Drug Store, located on the southeast corner of Commerce Street and Santa Rosa, as well as the Fiesta Furniture Store located on the northeast corner of Dolorosa and Santa Rosa Streets would be lost if the widening of Santa Rosa Street was carried through. He further stated that this particular area is considered a portion of the downtown business district and that numerous stores were individually operated, and if the Rosa Verde Project was carried out many of these individual businesses would be forced out of existence. Mr. Graves then filed a formal written protest.

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66-947 Mr. Edward Finck, attorney representing the Santa Rosa Medical Center, endorsed the Rosa Verde Project as presented.

Mayor McAllister inquired whether any other citizen or organization or spokesmen for organizations desired to be heard. There being no further requests by anyone in attendance to be heard, the Mayor declared the public hearing closed.

- 8-23-66 Petition of Mrs. H. H. Risinger and others requesting the City to make a survey of the drainage ditch which runs through North Alamo Heights and East Terrell Hills.
- 8-24-66 Petition of Joe Estrada and others requesting the City to take action to prevent the Roselawn Cemetery from using property known as NCB 7531, located at Cupples Road and Roselawn Street, for burial purposes.
