

AN ORDINANCE 14928

DECLARING THE STATEMENT OF CANVASS AND THE RESULT OF MUNICIPAL RUN-OFF ELECTION HELD ON THE 22ND DAY OF MAY, 1951.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. Came on this 23rd day of May, A.D. 1951, regularly to be canvassed the returns of the Municipal Run-off Election held on the 22nd day of May, A.D. 1951, to determine the Commissioner of Police and Fire of the City of San Antonio under its Charter for the ensuing term of office of two years;

2. And the Mayor and Commissioners having met to prepare a statement of canvass of the returns and to declare the result of said election in the manner provided by law, and after considering, determining and canvassing all matters of fact appertaining thereto; we, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, do make this statement of the canvass, and hereby find and declare the result of the said Run-off election to be tabulated as follows:

FOR COMMISSIONER OF POLICE AND FIRE:

"FOR" G. M. Roper ..... 2700 votes

3. And it appearing to the Mayor and Commissioners that the name of the candidate was submitted, and that the election was held and conducted, and that the returns thereof were made, all as required by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, the laws of the State of Texas, the proclamation of the Mayor and law for such cases made and provided, and that at said Run-off election there was cast for said candidate, the aggregate number of votes "FOR", all as shown above.

4. And the Mayor and Commissioners having first canvassed said returns and having found the same in all things correct, the same was thereupon adopted by majority vote of the Mayor and Commissioners; and it is further declared that as the result of said Run-off election, the elective officer of the City of San Antonio for Commissioner of Police and Fire for the two years commencing the 1st day of June, A.D. 1951, is as follows: G. M. Roper, Commissioner of Police and Fire, and that he was elected by receiving a majority of all the votes cast for the office for which he was a candidate, cast by the qualified voters of the City of San Antonio voting at said Run-off election, and he is hereby declared to be the lawful and duly elected Commissioner of Police and Fire of the City of San Antonio.
