 AN ORDINANCE 04-95

REGULATING THE SOLICITATION OF FUNDS AND THE RAISING OF CONTRIBUTIONS OVER THE TELEPHONE WITHIN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit funds or attempt to raise contributions for any purpose over the telephone within the City of San Antonio without securing a permit from the Mayor, as herein provided.
2. Any person who shall solicit funds or raise contributions over the telephone shall make sign and swear to a statement which shall be filed with the Vigilance Committee which shall contain substantially the following information:-
 - (a) Date; (b) Name of solicitor or solicitors; (c) Address and telephone number or numbers of such solicitor or solicitors; (d) Name of person, organization or cause for which the funds are solicited; (e) Address of person, organization or headquarters for such cause; (f) Number of persons intended to be employed in such solicitation and their names and addresses; (g) The percentage of the funds collected which are to be retained by the solicitor and his agents and the percentage of the funds collected which are to be used in behalf of the person, organization or cause.
3. The Committee shall keep each application on file and a record of its action thereon, in a well-bound book, subject to inspection by any person at any reasonable time.
4. Upon the recommendation of the Vigilance Committee to grant the permit, the Mayor, if he concurs in the conclusions of the Vigilance Committee, may grant a permit to the applicant to do things permitted.
5. Said permit shall be dated and signed by the Mayor and shall be valid during the term specified, not to exceed one month after the date of the issuance.
6. The permit herein described shall be inscribed upon a card which shall be endorsed in read letters "NOT TRANSFERRABLE".
7. Upon the expiration of the permit, application may be made for another permit which may

be granted upon the fulfillment by the applicant of the conditions herein specified.

8. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$200.00.

9. This ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City of San Antonio, except where there is an irreconcilable conflict between this ordinance and any other ordinance heretofore passed, the former ordinance shall be repealed to the extent of the conflict.

AN ORDINANCE OH-96

Levying special taxes for the payment of interest on and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment of certain issues of bonds, issued on the credits of Improvement Districts No. 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14, in the City of San Antonio, Texas, for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$30,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 2, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 13th day of October 1903, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of three Cents (3) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this state, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 2, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 2: That for the payment of interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$38,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 3, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of December, 1904, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Four Cents (4) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation of all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 3, in the City of San Antonio, as the said has

been defined by/the City Council of said City.

Section 3: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$221,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 4, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 8th day of February 1913, in accordance with Section 54, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933, and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Twelve Cents (12) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 4, in the City of San Antonio, as same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 4: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$45,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 7, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 15th day of July, 1908, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Four Cents (4) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 7, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 5: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 8, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 14th day of March, 1905, in accordance with Section 54, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Three Cents (3) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 8, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 6: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$55,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 9, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 3rd day of March 1905, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Four Cents (4) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 9, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 7: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$43,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 10, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 4th day of August 1905, in accordance with Section 54, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Four Cents (4) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 10, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 8: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$120,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 11, as authorized at a special election

held in said Improvement District on the 12th day of December 1905, in accordance with Section 54, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Two Cents (2) on the One Hundred Dollars Valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 11 in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 9: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$5,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 12, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 17th day of September, 1909, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933, and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Two Cents (2) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 12, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by Ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 10: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$20,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 13, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 10th day of August 1909, in accordance with Section 54, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Three Cents (3) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as said Improvement District No. 13, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council of said City.

Section 11: That for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of Bonds in the sum of \$17,500.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 14, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of June 1919, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a sinking fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933, and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Seven Cents (7) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 14, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

AN ORDINANCE 011-97

Levying an advalorem and occupation tax for the support of the City Government of the City of San Antonio, and levying a tax to pay the interest on the bonded debt of said City, and to create a sinking fund thereof, and a special tax of the support of the Carnegie Library in said City, all said taxes being levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1: That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, on all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the limits

of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of the State, and Ordinances of this City, an Advalorem Tax of and at the rate of 84/100 cents (\$.84) upon every One Hundred Dollars valuation.

Section 2: That to provide for the payment of the annual interest on all outstanding bonds of the City, issued prior to the year 1913, other than district improvement Bonds, and to produce a sinking fund with which to pay such bonded indebtedness at maturity, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Three (3) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned or referred to in Section 1 hereof; and for the fiscal year 1933 all collections on account of said levy made, shall be received and expended as a part of the General Sinking Fund of said bonds the same as heretofore, notwithstanding any ordinance to the contrary.

Section 3: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$1,500,000.00 for Paving Public Streets and Public Places, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Four and EightyTwo one-hundredth (4.82) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$800,000.00 for constructing Sanitary Sewers, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Two and Sixty One one-hundredth (2.61) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation, on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$25,000.00 for Constructing Sidewalks & Curbing, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Seven one-hundredth (.07) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$175,000.00 for Constructing a Police and Fire Station, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Fifty Four one - hundredth (.54) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 7: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$275,000.00 for Opening and Widening Streets, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax on One and Nineteen one-hundredth (1.19) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 8: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for the Construction of Concrete Bridges and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Thirty one-hundredth (.30) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 9: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$300,000.00 for constructing Storm Sewers and Drains, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied

for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Ninety Three one-hundredth (.93) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 10: That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$125,000.00 for constructing a City Hospital, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1933 and ending May 31, 1934, a special tax of Forty one-hundredth (.40) cents on every One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

CONTRACT

THE STATE OF TEXAS,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

1. That this instrument in writing witnesseth a lease contract, the provisions and stipulations hereinafter specified, between the City of San Antonio, acting herein by its Mayor, duly authorized by an ordinance passed and approved by the Commissioners, and the undersigned, C. W. Hay, A. Robinson and P. A. Dwyer, all of the County of Bexar, State of Texas, except C. W. Hay, a resident of the City of Frankfort Frankline County, State of Kentucky.

2. That the City of San Antonio leases to the above named parties, the following described property, to-wit:

All those certain tracts or parcels of land lying and being in Bexar County, Texas, on the North side of the Saint Hedwig Road and East of the Right of Way of the San Antonio Belt and Terminal Railway Company, out of Original City Lots Six (6) and Seven (7), and the "Rail Road Reserve", in District 1, of the Ancient City Tract, and out of Survey Number Fifteen (15), patented to George W. Paschal, assignee of Guillermo Nunez, on August 1, 1854, on August 1, 1854, by Patent No. 119, Volume 11, embraced within the following field notes, to-wit:

Beginning at a fence corner on the north side of the Saint Hedwig Road and the East right-of-way fence of the San Antonio Belt and Terminal Company, for the Southwest Corner of this tract of land;

Thence along said East right-of-way fence North 1923.0 feet to an angle point;

known as the EXPOSITION GROUNDS, for a period of 20 years, and for the purpose of conducting a modern race track, with all equipment and building necessary and essential for the conducting and holding of race meets; the lease shall, however, in no manner affect the mineral rights conveyed to J. W. Johnson by the City of San Antonio, and the easement granted to the San Antonio Belt and Terminal Railroad Company and Missouri-Kansas-Texas Railroad Company, by the City of San Antonio.

3. That one of the buildings to be constructed by the lessees upon the above described property is to be reinforced concrete grandstands, immediately adjacent to the race track, of a seating capacity and to accomodate not less than 6,000 persons.

4. That there are to be constructed by the lessees stables of the most modern design, sufficient to accomodate not less than 1,500 horses.

5. That all of the above named buildings, stables and equipment shall be constructed, completed and ready for use by January 1, 1935, otherwise, this lease contract shall be, at the option of the City of San Antonio, terminated and at an end.

6. The consideration moving between the parties for the execution of this lease is as follows:

(a) The City of San Antonio is to receive an annual rental of not less than \$10,000.00, \$5,000.00 of such annual rental is to be paid by lessees to the City of San Antonio on the second day of the Racing Meet to be held between December 15, 1934 and January 15, 1935. If no Racing Meet be held between said two dates, the sum of \$5,000.00 is to be due and payable on or before January 15, 1935, and this rule is to apply to each subsequent year. The Racing Meets to be held during each subsequent year shall be held between the above two dates unless otherwise changed by the Racing Commission of the State of Texas. If the dates for the Racing Meet be changed by the Racing Commission, the sum of \$5,000.00 shall be due and payable on the second day of the Racing Meet to be designated by the Racing Commission, and if the Racing Commission should designate a date for any year during the term of this contract and no Racing Meet be held, the sum of \$5,000.00 shall be due and payable on or before 90 days after the date designated by the Commission. The said sum of not less than \$5,000.00 shall be paid to the City of San Antonio by lessees whether a race meet be held or not or whether the State Racing Commission designates a date for racing or not. If no such date be designated, such sum of \$5,000.00 shall become due and payable on or before January 15 of each year during the life of this contract. This rule shall apply to any subsequent year. The City of San Antonio is to also receive one day's total gross receipts after deducting the necessary expenses in conducting the Racing Meet for that day, during each Race Meet to be held each year.

It is the intention and the understanding of the parties that the sum of \$10,000.00 shall be paid annually during the life of this contract in any and all events.

(b) The sum of \$5,000.00 shall be paid to the City of San Antonio on the second day of the Racing Meet to be held in the spring of 1935 and during the spring of each subsequent year, the dates of said Meet to be designated by the Racing Commission. If no Racing Meet is held during the spring of any subsequent year, the sum of \$5,000.00 shall be due and payable on the 1st day of June of such year that no Racing Meet is held.

(c) The City of San Antonio is to receive also during the Racing Meet to be held during the spring of 1935 and during the spring of each subsequent year one day's total gross receipts after deducting the necessary expenses for conducting that days' Race Meet; it is especially understood and agreed that the amount realized from the two meets to be held each year during the period of this lease contract shall not be less than \$10,000.00 and said sum is hereby guaranteed by lessees, their legal representatives and assigns.

(d) If the total gross receipts after deducting the necessary expenses

for conducting one day's Race Meet to be paid to the City of San Antonio for one day during the Race Meet during the period between December 15, 1934 and January 15, 1935 and each subsequent year, and the total gross receipts after deducting the necessary expenses for one day's Race Meet to be held in the spring of 1935 and for each subsequent year, shall exceed \$10,000.00 for such year, the annual rental of \$10,000.00 for that year shall be credited against such total gross receipts after the necessary expenses have been deducted, if the rental has theretofore been paid. The necessary expenses for one day's Race Meet shall not exceed the average daily expenses for any Race Meet.

7. Should there at any time be any default in the payment of rentals provided herein, or should there be any breach of any of the covenants or conditions herein contained, or any abandonment of the premises, the City of San Antonio may, at its option, declare this lease canceled and re-enter said premises and remove all persons therefrom and take possession of all property of lessees thereon, without prejudice to any legal remedy existing for the collection of rents or the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this lease, all claims for damages, if any, by reason of such re-entry being hereby expressly waived.

8. Upon the termination of this lease for any cause, all improvements and buildings placed thereon shall become the absolute property of the City of San Antonio, and it is the intention of the parties that such buildings and improvements shall be realty.

9. Upon the termination of this lease the lessees may remove all personal property from the premises of the lessees are not indebted to the City of San Antonio in any particular, provided, however, that all buildings, appurtenances and equipment shall remain the absolute property of the City of San Antonio. The City of San Antonio shall have, and is hereby given, a valid lien upon all improvements, buildings, structures and personal property belonging to the lessees upon said premises during the term of this lease as security for the payment of all rentals due or to become due herein, and for the performance of all other obligations hereunder.

10. The lessees agree that in the construction of the necessary buildings herein contemplated San Antonio materials are to be used and San Antonio labor is to be used as far as possible (technical experts excluded), and all contractors or sub-contractors engaged by the lessees herein shall compensate such labor according to the prevailing wage scale.

11. If the lessees herein shall desire to incorporate and procure a charter for the purpose of operating the race track herein referred to, the general public shall not be solicited to purchase any stock of said corporation through salesman, letters or advertisements; lessees, however, shall have the right to sell stock of such corporation to any person desiring to obtain an interest in such enterprise.

12. The lessees may transfer and assign this lease contract to such corporation when so organized, but if the lessees herein shall desire to convey or assign this lease to any other person or persons or any corporation other than the one contemplated by the parties herein, the permission of the City Council shall be first obtained in writing.

13. The lessees herein shall hold the City harmless, indemnify and reimburse it against any damages against it as a result of any injury to persons using or occupying the above described premises and buildings, and lessees shall make active defense of any suit arising out of any claim for damages against the City of San Antonio as a result of injuries to persons in and upon said property and buildings.

14. This lease contract is entered into with the further express condition that the race meets to be conducted, as contemplated by this lease, shall be in full conformity with the laws of the State of Texas and any and all rules promulgated by the Racing Commission of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of San Antonio, and the use of the premises by the lessees shall in no manner be in violation of any of the laws of the United States, the State of Texas or

any ordinance of the City of San Antonio.

15. A portion of the premises herein described is now being occupied by a unit or the National Guard and unless the portion so occupied is needed immediately to carry out the provisions of this lease contract, it is agreed that such unit may continue to occupy that portion of the property until it becomes necessary and needful for the conduct of any race meet.

16. No building now situated upon the above described property shall be dismantled until lessees are ready and able to start construction of said race tract, its appurtenances and equipment and such buildings shall not be dismantled until permission of the City Council has been obtained to do so, but such permission shall not be withheld if and when lessees produce evidence of their ability and readiness to proceed with such construction. All salvaged material is to be delivered upon the ground to the officers and agents of the City of San Antonio.

17. If any of the provisions and stipulations of this lease contract shall be violated by lessees herein, this lease shall automatically terminated and be at an end, and all buildings, appurtenances and equipment situated upon the property herein described shall be forfeited to the City of San Antonio.

18. The lessees shall not permit any lien of any character to be fixed upon the realty herein described, and the City of San Antonio shall in no event be liable for any water furnished or to be furnished to the lessees herein by the Water Works Board of Trustees.

19. The lessees shall make all necessary sewer, water, gas and electricity and all other public utility connections, and shall promptly pay all charges that may be made for such service.

20. The foregoing instrument in writing constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, there being no other written or parol agreement with any officer or employee of the City, it being understood that the charter of the City requires all of the contracts with the City to be in writing and authorized by ordinance.

21. IN WITNESS WHEREOF said City of San Antonio has fully caused these presents to be executed by C. K. Quin, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, and the corporate seal of said City to be hereto affixed, and this instrument to be attested by the City Clerk, and said C. W. Hay, A. Robinson and P. A. Dwyer do now sign, execute and deliver this instrument as the contract and agreement of said lessees, this the 22nd day of March, A. D. 1934.

AN ORDINANCE **OH-98**

AMENDING SECTION 3 OF "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING 'MILK' AND CERTAIN MILK PRODUCTS; 'MILK PRODUCER'; 'PASTEURIZATION', PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ADULTERATED AND MIS-BRANDED MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, REQUIRING PERMITS FOR THE SALE OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, REGULATING THE INSPECTION OF DAIRY FARMS AND MILK PLANTS, THE TESTING, GRADING, LABELING, PLACARDING, PASTEURIZATION, RE-GRADING, DISTRIBUTION, SALE, AND DENATURING OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS, PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLISHING OF MILK GRADES, THE CONSTRUCTION OF FUTURE DARIES AND MILK PLANTS, THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND THE FIXING OF PENALTIES".

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-
