COMPETING PROPOSALS

RESTRICTION ON COMMUNICATIONS

Respondent is prohibited from communicating with City Staff, elected City officials and their staff regarding the P3 or submittal from the time the P3 Request for Competing Proposals has been released until the City requests a meeting to negotiate a contract with your firm OR a contract is posted as a City Council agenda item. These restrictions extend to “thank you” letters, phone calls, emails and any contact that results in the direct or indirect discussion of the P3 and/or submittal submitted by Respondents. Violation of this provision by Respondent and/or its agent may lead to disqualification of Respondent’s submittal from consideration. The only exceptions to the restrictions on communication with City employees are as follows: Respondents may submit written questions concerning this P3 to the P3 Administrator listed in the address below until 4:00 PM on October 10, 2014. NOTICE REGARDING PROHIBITION ON CAMPAIGN OR OFFICEHOLDER CONTRIBUTIONS FOR INDIVIDUALS AND ENTITIES SEEKING HIGH-PROFILE CONTRACTS

Under Section 2-309 of the Municipal Campaign Finance Code, the following are prohibited from making a campaign or officeholder contribution to any member of City Council, candidate for City Council or political action committee that contributes to City Council elections from the 10th business day after a contract solicitation has been released until 30 calendar days after the contract has been awarded:

1. legal signatory of a high-profile contract;
2. any individual seeking a high-profile contract;
3. any owner or officer of an entity seeking a high-profile contract;
4. the spouse of any of these individuals;
5. any attorney, lobbyist or consultant retained to assist in seeking contract.

A high-profile contract cannot be awarded to the individual or entity if a prohibited contribution has been made by any of these individuals during the “black out” period.
